Salute to OUR SOUTHSIDE HEROES

Upgraded facilities, new staff and training help to keep our community safer in the past year

Several Johnson County fire and police departments have expanded their efforts to better serve their community in the past year through training and hiring additional staff (including a crisis intervention team to assist those with mental illness) and adding vital equipment and upgrading facilities. As well, a local fire department remembers a paramedic for his extensive experience and education as well as his kind and caring spirit. We thank our Southside heroes for their daily commitment to safety.

Bargersville Police Department

Bargersville police have seen significant changes within their department, including the expansion of both their patrol and infrastructure. Justin Griggs, formerly a sergeant, has been promoted to assistant chief, and Officer Bradley Moore received a promotion to sergeant. As well, two full-time officers have been hired: Jessica Hester and Taeha Stieglitz. BPD plans to hire one more full-time officer in October.

The new building for the police department is now complete. "It is a modern facility with the ability to fit our staffing needs for now and in the future," said Jeremy Roll, public information officer with BPD. "We have expanded our electric vehicle fleet to 10 Teslas which has kept us at around \$60 per month in charging per vehicle. This is a \$450 per month, per vehicle savings, over our traditional fleet."

Johnson County Sheriff's Office

Members of the Johnson County Sheriff's Office participate in many activities throughout the county while speaking with residents on how to protect themselves and remain safe. "We believe in community policing and educating people about what is occurring in Johnson County," said Johnson

County Sheriff Duane E. Burgess.

Officers receive training to help them face the stressors and rigors of police work. Deputy Hannah Greene is currently attending a 16-week mandatory training with the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy.

Entertaining activities include presenting the colors during high school basketball games.

The department has a group of reserves who dedicate many hours throughout the month to assist with covering shifts and working special events throughout the year. "We are very fortunate to have several hard-working reserves on staff," said Burgess.

Johnson County Sheriff's Office has created a CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) Division that consists of three officers or deputies that respond and assist with people who are having mental health issues. Most of the department's deputies and other Johnson County Law Enforcement officers are certified CIT Officers.

White River Township Fire Department

White River Township Fire Department has experienced a range of emotions this past year, from the loss of Paramedic Kyle Martincic in the line of duty to the sense of accomplishment in opening a new public safety building with the Bargersville Community Fire Department, Center Grove School Police, Johnson County Sheriff's Office and Center Grove Schools. "The resiliency of the men and women on our department is a testament to their commitment to serving this community," said Fire Chief Jeremy A. Pell.

Paramedic Kyle Martincic joined the WRTFD in 2019. "He had special way of making people smile due to his gentle spirit

and incredible kindness," said Pell. "These gifts were matched by his vast experience and education in EMS. Kyle inspired those around him to provide the best possible EMS care with a caring spirit. Kyle's sudden passing while on duty was a shock to all of us and has left a void that will never be fully filled."

The department has added additional equipment, training and a facility to improve response times and advance EMS services in the community. The Center Grove School Corporation's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) opened, which also serves as Fire Station 254. "The thing that makes this accomplishment so special is the partnership between WRTFD, Bargersville Community Fire Department, Center Grove School Police and the Johnson County Sheriff's Office. All four agencies worked together to staff the facility just a few hundred yards from the largest Center Grove School campus," said Pell. The facility houses a WRTFD ambulance, a BCFD ladder truck and multiple police officers. "Combining police, fire and EMS in the heart of our community on a school campus is one of the first of its kind in the nation," Pell continued. "Everyone benefits from this mission-based collaborative approach to public safety. Not only does it make our community safer, but it is also an efficient use of taxpayer resources. A model such as this is a game-changer for responding to 911 emergencies in White River Township. Lives will be changed for the better because progressive community leaders in Johnson County supported this effort."

New study: Tourism contributes \$341.3 million to Johnson County economy

A new economic impact study shows tourism contributed \$341.3 million to Johnson County's economy in 2021, up from \$255.7 million in 2017.

The economic impact represents an 8.4% annual spending increase each year.

"This study confirms what we see firsthand, that our hotels have a strong occupancy rate, that our festivals are attracting big crowds, and that our attractions and tourism-related businesses are sustaining their success," said Kenneth Kosky, executive director of Festival Country Indiana, Johnson County's official tourism agency.

Kosky said the annual growth is especially impressive considering that it occurred despite the pandemic. He said Festival Country increased its advertising reach during the pandemic to help local restaurants, stores and other tourism businesses survive and even thrive.

Festival Country Indiana began operating in 2017. Johnson County was one of the last counties in Indiana to form a tourism agency.

An economic impact study conducted in 2013, prior to Festival Country's existence, showed that the economic impact of tourism declined .5% year over year.

The new economic impact study, conducted by Certec, Inc., showed that tourism jobs grew from 2,921 to 3,365, and that taxes generated grew from \$60.2 to \$80.3 million. Destination travelers grew from 1 million to 1.2 million, while pass-through travelers grew from 1.35 million to 1.38 million.

The study showed that 40.3% of visitors

stay one to three nights, while 30.6% are in for a day trip. In addition, 46.8% are on their first trip to the county.

The top attractions in the county include Mal-low Run Winery, restaurants, shopping, aquatic centers, The Historic Artcraft Theatre, Rascal's Fun Zone, Whiteland Raceway Park, parks, Otte Golf, the Festival Country visitor center, Apple Works, splash pads, historic downtown Franklin, Johnson County Museum, and live music.

"Tourism is a large, growing business in Johnson County," said Jim Carr, president of Certec.

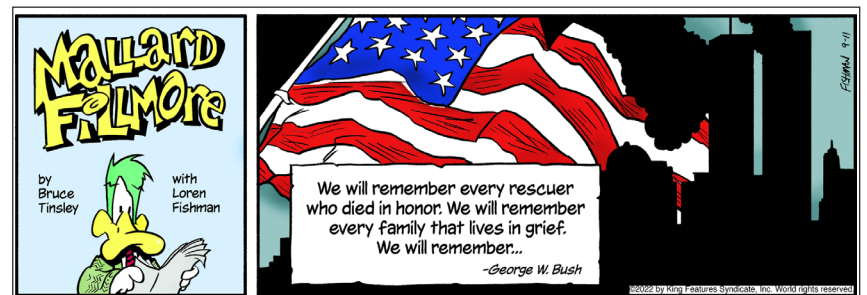
Certec's study included data analysis as well as in-person interviews and research in Johnson County.

"This study supports what we hear from tourism-related businesses who track the zip codes of their customers. They say that significant spending comes from people outside of Johnson County," Kosky said.

In addition to marketing Johnson County's communities and attractions, and operating the county visitor center in downtown Franklin, Festival Country also engages in product development by offering grants to help create new attractions and festivals, and by building attractions like the Gatling Gauntlet obstacle course at Johnson County Park. These efforts improve quality of life for residents and make the communities more attractive to visitors.

Certec's findings are just one metric that Festival Country Indiana uses to chart its immediate and long-term impact. Other studies and reports show increases in hotel revenue, advertising impressions, website traffic, social media interaction and media reach.

Upstream Prevention supports installation of 14 NaloxBoxes

Public Education – The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported more than 932,000 people have died since 1999 from a drug overdose (CDC, WONDER). In 2020, 75% of the nearly 92,000 drug overdoses in the country involved an opioid (CDC, WONDER). Upstream announced the installation of 14 NaloxBoxes in Johnson County in time for Overdose Awareness Day on Aug. 31 to address overdoses in the community. A NaloxBox increases the availability of the life-saving medication Naloxone (NARCAN) to the general public through increased access to the harm reduction tool. Research shows increased availability of NARCAN reduces the number of opioid overdose deaths, and increased involvement with treatment (OverdoseLifeline.org). When administered, NARCAN only impacts the opioid receptors in the brain,

thereby only impacting an individual who has opioids in their system. Upstream has partnered with a variety of local organizations to offer Layperson Naloxone Administration training to their employees, as well as partnered with the Johnson County Public Library system to offer this free training to the community over the next six months. Training in the administration of Naloxone and the NaloxBoxes are funded in part through a state department of health grant (IN CARES ECHO) as well as a grant from the Duke Energy Foundation. Funding from these two sources allows Upstream to offer both the training and the NaloxBoxes free of cost to Johnson County residents. One such training will take place at the White River Branch Library on Sept. 25, 2 - 3 p.m. For more information, visit upstreamprevention.org.

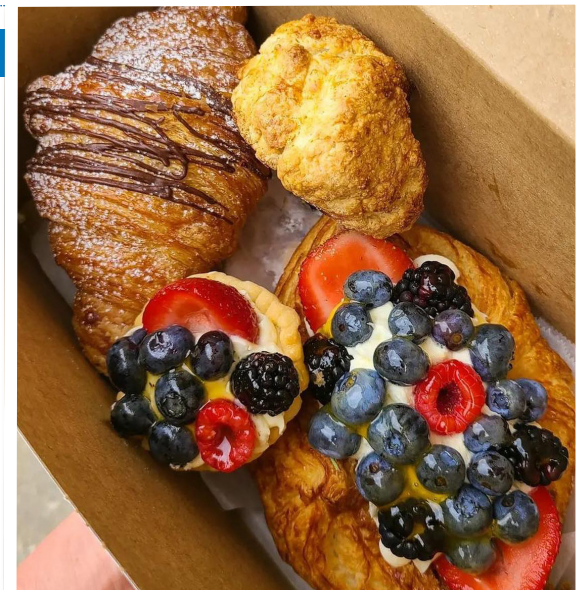
Weep, Their Banner of Monument

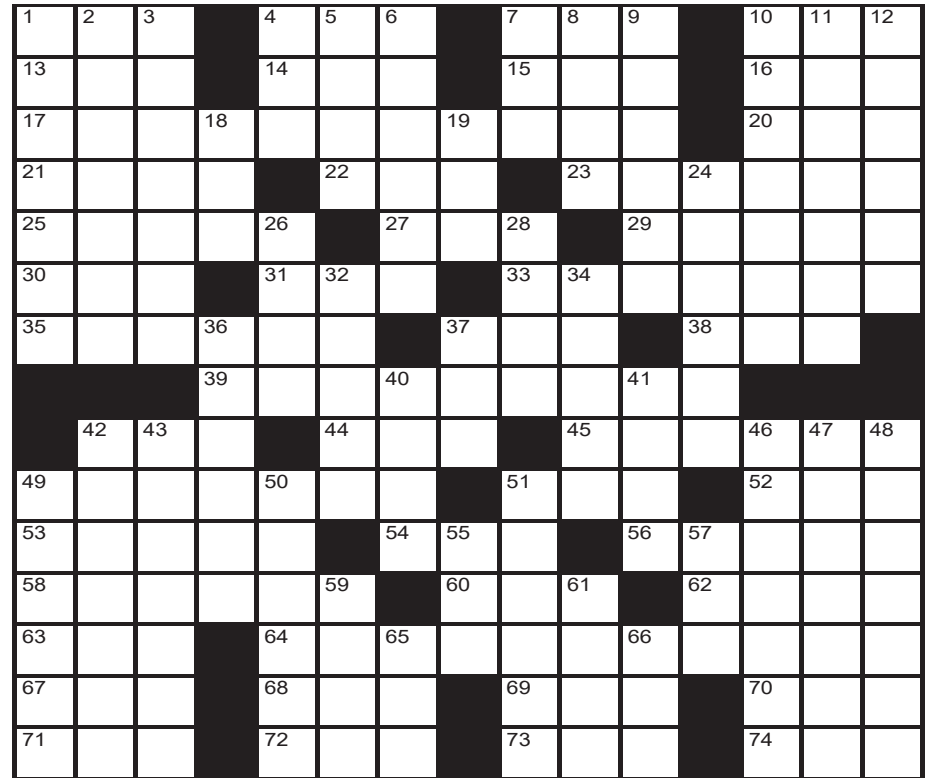

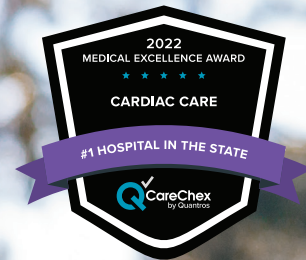
