## BACK2BACK The Trojans have done it again

The Trojans did it again. In the rematch of the 2020 championship game, the Trojans came out on top in a nail-biter 27-21 win over Westfield. The matchup was a repeat of last year, where the Trojans won 38-14.

On the first drive, the Trojans were able to make a defensive stop which gave them an opportunity to score, which they acted on but missed the field goal. Afterward Westfield was able to capitalize on their drive. The second guarter is where the Trojans took the lead with a two-yard rushing touchdown from senior defensive end Caden Curry and 30 yard pass from senior quarterback Tayven Jackson to senior wide receiver Harrison Stomps across the middle and down the sideline.

The Trojans final score came in the third quarter after junior running back Micah Coyle took a five yard rush into the end zone. The bigger story of the night was both sides' defense. One sack and one turnover were the moments that were able to help the Trojans gain momentum.

"Coming into this game, we knew that offense was gonna have us mapped out," Curry said after the game. "They knew every little weakness in our offense and all the little things that can get yards for them. They took everything they could get. We knew we had to keep fighting and have one or two turnovers and that our

offense would keep moving and we could just fight until the end."

The entire game was a back-and-forth between the Trojans and Shamrocks but it all came down to one play late in the fourth quarter. Westfield quarterback Maximus Webster drops back for a pass and just after he releases, junior

linebacker Owen Bright, who up until this year was a running back, made a game-winning interception, sealing the game for the Trojans.

"They had thrown a couple of the same routes over and over inside of me all night and I figured this is the biggest play of the season right here," Bright said after the game. "It's win or lose right here so I figured they'd go back to it so I scooted over a little inside and saw the ball come my way, I practiced catching those balls all the time."

Bright also assisted six total tackles, one sack and two force fumbles.

> 'You don't win state championships unless you have good quarterbacks and great defenses, the offense and the quarterback controls the game but defense wins championships and our defense has been unbelievable all season long, 28 straight games," head coach Eric Moore said.

Other notable stat lines were senior safety Mitchell Evans adding eight total tackles. On offense, Coyle led the Trojans with 79 rushing yards and one touchdown, Jackson threw for 152 yards and one touchdown and Trojans

kicker Nolan Foley made three of four extra points.

This game marked the 28th-consecutive win for Center Grove. Being able to extend their streak gave the Trojan seniors a happy final sendoff.

After the game Moore spoke about the game over the intercom at the stadium.

"Tonight was a great high school football game played by two great communities and two great high schools," Moore said. "Westfield played so hard and did a good job as anybody has in two years of playing us. All the credit to them. Jay Gilbert [Westfield] is a fine high school football coach and their kids competed like champions like tonight."

After winning state last year, Moore ran into health problems stemming from surgery prep of a knee surgery he scheduled. During a surgery in which one of his kidneys was removed, tumors were found on his bladder. After being given the all-clear in July Moore was able to come back for another year.

"I lost more kidneys than I did football games but I'm ready to roll," Moore said.

### **Center Grove investigating** photos of student in blackface

Center Grove High School is investigating multiple social media posts, which have gone viral on various community Facebook groups, of what looks to be a member of its football team in blackface, who is allegedly mocking a Black player on another team.

The photos being investigated show a student wearing a Center Grove football jersey with the number covered up by the bus seat and Center Grove winter hat with his face covered in what looks like eve black, a common thing for football players under their eyes during games that helps with the reflection from stadium lights. In the photo, the student's entire face is covered in the eye black. The photos in question appear to have been taken on the bus after the Class 6A state championship on Saturday night.

Jeffry Henderson, principal of Center Grove High School, shared a statement saying, "CGHS administrators are aware of an inappropriate post on social media. They are investigating the situation and are taking steps to address it through the athletic department, coaching staff, and student discipline policy. This student's actions do not represent the values of our athletic program, high school, or school community."





## Bargersville looks to update its 5 year Parks and Recreation Master Plan

Parks - Every five years, the Town of Bargersville updates its parks and recreation master plan to help keep the parks in town updated as well as receive feedback from guests. ### 5 holiday card grammar mistakes to avoid

Put that turkey leg down and listen up! Today

we have to discuss your family's upcoming holiday card. In addition to the fact that we do not need to see your pets in your cards, we also don't need to see any glaring grammar mistakes. Stick to the following tips and you'll turn a bah, humbug card into a very merry message.

To keep your headings holly and jolly, write "Season's greetings." "Seasons greetings" isn't right because the "greetings" belong to the "season." Therefore, we need the apostrophe. Also, please refrain from writing "Sneezin' greetings." You may think that's funny, but it's snot.

Continuing on the theme of that grinch of a punctuation mark called the apostrophe, let's look at the phrase: 'tis the season. Never write "tis" with no apostrophe before it. 'Tis is a contraction (I like to call it a mashup) of "it" and "is." These days, we write and say "it's" instead of "tis," but the antiquated "tis" still enters into our collective holiday lexicon.

Okay, so it appears that all our holiday card woes stem from the pesky apostrophe. We see it again in the phrase "Happy New Year." Don't write "Happy New Year's" or "Happy New Years." However, "New Year's Day" and "New Year's Eve" are correct. When in doubt, simply write "Have a swell 2022."

You only need to capitalize the "m" in "Merry Christmas" if "Merry" begins a sen-

tence or if "Merry Christmas" is the heading at the top of your card. For instance, you would correctly write, "We hope you have a merry Christmas and a happy new year."

How do you write your family's last name on a card? Suppose your greeting says "Merry Christmas from the (your last name here)." Should the last name read "Kringle's" or "Kringles"? This is by far the most common holiday card faux pas. Never use an apostrophe here; instead, pluralize your last name by adding an "s." Your family name isn't possessing anything.

If your family name ends in -s, -ch, -sh, -z or -x (as long as the -x is not silent), ad -es to make your last name plural: Happy Holidays from the Joneses. If you want to avoid this plural vs. apostrophe confusion, simply write "Merry Christmas from the Miller family."

You and your family deserve great grammar and punctuation to go along with your coordinated family photo. No need to thank me when your friends and family decide to frame your card as the pinnacle of holiday merriment.
