## 2015 Hannah House Paranormal Meet & Greet on August 8

It's back! The 9th annual Hannah House Meet & Greet will resume its yearly tradition next Saturday, Aug. 8 on the grounds of the historic Hannah House located on the near Southside of Indianapolis. The meet & greet took a year off in 2014, but is back for 2015, bigger and better than ever.

The Hannah House was built in 1858 by Alexander Hannah, a prominent figure in Indianapolis history. The house was in sight of the developing city, yet far enough away to garner a degree of privacy and remoteness. The house purportedly was used for another purpose. It became a passageway for one of many stops along the Underground Railroad snaking through the state of Indiana; and then the tragedy...

Factor in a straw covered basement floor, oil lanterns and someone accidentally toppling one of these lamps, and you have a recipe for disaster. Legend has it that one such incident resulted in the deaths of many of these slaves. The story implies that Hannah buried those bodies in the basement to avoid detection.

The Hannah House has had many functions in the intervening years. For many of those years it was the annual Halloween Spook House. More often than not, the stately brick home was simply a tribute to the past as the city expanded around it. It was listed in 1978 as a "recognized" historical landmark by the U.S. Department of Interior.

Stories of continued haunting have per-

sisted throughout the years centered on those who perished in the basement fire, but also reported sightings of Hannah's wife Elizabeth.

The Paranormal Meet & Greet continues organizer Danielle Garrison's vision of bringing together paranormal enthusiasts and teams to aid in networking within the paranormal community. It is an opportunity to share ideas and technology. Public participation is an important factor in the event, drawing in those curious, with teams accessible for general questions and help where needed.

Teams will have booths set up, including paranormal researchers from out of state. The day will include psychic readers, authors, guest speakers, tours of the House, proprietors of haunted locales, filmmakers and vendors. The "haunted" Gas Light Inn—a long time fixture in Indianapolis—will provide the food.

Have your questions answered and rub elbows with individuals doing research into a world of possibilities. Take advantage of this once a year event!

#### Greenwood receives façade restoration grant

The city of Greenwood, in partnership, with Restore Old Town Greenwood, its Main Street organization, was awarded a \$400,000 Main Street Revitalization Façade Restoration Grant from the Office of Community & Rural Affairs. Additionally, \$578,722 from the Redevelopment Commission and \$193,430 from the property owners will finance the project. Twenty-two of the 33 downtown buildings will have their facades updated.

The design phase will begin as soon as the grant is executed. Using the Downtown Revitalization Plan as the guide for the facades, a team from Axis Architecture will work with building owners to finalize elevations and develop design documents that are planned to be put out to bid in November. Construction is slated to begin in Janu-

This is her race to lose

As the polling for presidential candidates on both sides of the aisle continues, it's interesting, but not alarming, to note the slip-page Hillary Rodham Clinton (D-N.Y.) is experiencing in certain sectors. For instance, one poll last week had her in a "statistical tie" with Bernie Sanders (D-Vt.), but that was for New Hampshire, the state bordering Sanders' home turf; she won New Hampshire in 2008, so tuck that away for now. Clinton's national lead amongst Democrats was shown to be shrinking, but we see that as a function of the field being crowded (although not as irresponsibly congested as the Republicans' freak show), and her lead was 51-22 over Sanders, whereas she was at 59 percent the week prior. ## Maggie Christy named 2015 Miss Math Indiana after graduating in the top 10 of her Franklin Central class, taking a leadership role in starting the school's robotics club

Margaret "Maggie" Christy had a goal of taking every math class available at her high school – and she did. She graduated in the spring from Franklin Central in the Top 10 of her class with seven college-level math classes completed.

On top of her academic achievements, she was also one of six students who started the high school's VEX Robotics team, Auto Flashes, her sophomore year, helping the team go to the Worlds championship in its second year. Her leadership and love of mathematics led to the recent announce-

ment by Governor Mike Pence that she was named Miss Math Indiana 2015.

"I was really excited that I was picked as Miss Math Indiana," Christy said. "It was a pretty good scholarship opportunity. I thought it fit me pretty well since I love math."

Christy, the daughter of Ed and Lori Christy, said that she discovered her love for math in elementary school, when the students were given math charts. The students were timed, and Christy said she always finished among the fastest. In middle school, she was assigned to a high learning program, taking upper level math classes.

Her sophomore year in high school, she was invited to help start a robotics team. Mayor Greg Ballard was giving robotics kits to schools which wanted to start a team.

"We did really well that year," Christy said. "We won the design award that year. Each year we've won something... There were six kids who started it originally. Now we're up to about 60 and four teams. I think it's going to grow even more this year. I'm really excited to see what it has in store."

Christy served as an ambassador for the city in her senior year, later serving as the state ambassador at the 2015 Worlds competition.

"I've learned so much about robotics, but what's impacted me the most was my organization and leadership skills," Christy said. "The first year we started I helped build and got into programming. Our coach that was a senior graduated and I filled in for that. In two years I've really learned how to work with my peers and lead them in a ways that we're still successful."

Through high school, Christy was also actively involved in the student council, serving as co-president one year. She volunteered as a math tutor, and plans to continue that in college. She also competed in 4-H in sewing for nine years, making it to the Indiana State Fair every year. She served as a volunteer for the Indian Creek Christian Church Access Ministry, as a "buddy" for children with special needs during Parent Night Out events.

Miss Math Indiana is a \$1,000 scholarship, selected by a panel of STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) professionals. Christy also received the National Center for Women & Information Technology Aspirations in Computing Award and the Purdue Presidential scholarship. Through the NCWIT award, she received an internship this summer with GlobalNoc, a network operations center in downtown Indianapolis.

Christy will attend Purdue University this fall, majoring in actuarial science, a mathematical and statistical method that assesses risk in the insurance, finance and other industries, and applied statistics. She plans to remain active in college, and has already talked with the Purdue robotics team and is looking into its math clubs.

"I'm really excited to do that and stay with my passion of robotics," Christy said. "I really just like STEM. Robotics was an applied way to get into that. I really like the hands-on part of building it and programming it. In classes you just sit in a lecture and talk. I really like how robotics, you get an objective, you have your constraints, but you can come up with an idea, build it, drive it, compete with it and it's your own."

■ **What happened?** Old business: Ordinances 14, 15 and 16 were approved on third and final reading. Ordinance 17 was approved on second reading.

■ **What it means?** Ordinance 14 gives additional appropriation to the Public Safety LOIT Fund to fill the city's needs of purchasing security cameras for City Hall, a new fire truck, a fence around the police station and a secure, ADA compliant front door for the police station. It would also allow the removal of the above-ground fuel storage tank at the Churchman Avenue police station.

Ordinance 15 amends the personnel manual regarding employee classifications.

Ordinance 16 was introduced by Councilor Anthony Davidson. It would forbid parking on Glengyle Avenue, 20 feet north of the dead end.

Ordinance 17 is a salary ordinance adjusting salaries for appointed employees in the fire department. It was stated that this was already done for the police department.

■ **What's next?** Ordinance 17 will face third and final reading at the Tuesday, Sept. 8 meeting.

■ **What happened?** Ordinance 18, 19 and 20 were introduced and approved on first reading.

■ **What it means?** Ordinance 18 changes the code of ordinances for traffic schedules.

Ordinance 19 states that address must be marked and prominently displayed on the front of buildings: residences and businesses. Councilor Anthony Davidson amended the fines for violation to \$40 plus \$5 per day for 10 days after final notice.

Ordinance 20 would create a three-way stop at 4th and Bettcher.

■ **What's next?** These ordinances will be read again on the Tuesday, Sept. 8, 7 p.m. meeting.



### Greenwood Common Council

Meeting, Aug. 3

■ **What happened?** Ordinances 15-41 and 15-42 were both postponed until the next meeting. Ordinances 15-39 and 08 were approved on first reading.

■ **What it means?** Ordinance 15-39 would prohibit tax-exempt uses of real estate within the districts in Greenwood unless agreements for payments in lieu of taxes are in place.

Ordinance 15-08 would rename a portion of Stop 18 Road to Evan Springer Blvd. Evan Springer became the director of the Department Parks and Recreation in 1978, serving for Greenwood for 38 years.

■ **What's next?** These ordinances will be voted on their second reading on Wednesday, Sept. 9.

■ **What happened?** Ordinances 15-38 and 44 and Resolution 15-07 were approved on second and final reading.

■ **What it means?** Resolution 15-07 would declare a certain area within Greenwood an economic revitalization area, qualifying certain property improvements for tax abatement.

Ordinance No. 15-38 approved the appropriation of funds for the Fire Department to complete maintenance and upgrades to Fire Station 91, 155 E. Main St.

■ **What's next?** This ordinance/resolution will go into effect.

I spend time with my family, watch my kids play sports, boating, cook-outs.

#### What are your future goals, professionally or personally?

I'm doing the job that I wanted to do right out of high school. My future goal is where I'm at now, being a police officer. I enjoy working the road. So I'll stay right here, helping our citizens in Beech Grove.

#### What would you have done if you hadn't become a police officer?

I really enjoy working on my own cars. I have an ATV that I work on. So I might have gone into the mechanic field.

## Summer tomato

### NUTRITION

You needn't remind me: tomatoes are a popular summer harvest. This season, I finally nailed the soil mix and by golly, my tomatoes plants are producing faster than we can eat them. So I gifted a bag to a neighbor this weekend, but before I returned home, someone had left a gift-bag of their tomato abundance on our fence.

Hard as tennis balls, flavorless grocery tomatoes are nasty, genetically modified attempts to haughtily graft the hand of Gods perfect Celestial Apothecary.

Sandi and I have made raw salsa, Pico de gallo, tomato sauce for pasta, caprese, juice or added them to sandwich wraps, garden salads, smoothies, kebab's, and stir fry. Our favorite is a raw, chopped tomato with olive oil, basil chopped green onions, black pepper and Himalayan salt, and a goodly amount of raw garlic. We toss this blend with pasta or quinoa and eat it air-temperature.

Hard to imagine, but up a hundred years ago, tomatoes, due to their membership in the Nightshade family, were presumed poisonous. Long before tomatoes were considered fit to eat the multicolored orbs were grown only as an ornamental garden plant, sometimes called "love apple."

Tomatoes are heavenly treasure of riches regarding their antioxidant benefits. In terms of conventional antioxidants, tomatoes provide an excellent amount of vitamin C, beta-carotene; the mineral manganese; and a good

amount of vitamin E. (whfoods.com) Tomatoes are widely known for their outstanding antioxidant protection their rich concentration of lycopene.

Tomatoes vitamin A, aka beta-carotene, is as an anti-oxidant that neutralizes dangerous free radicals in your blood stream. Vitamin A feeds your eyes; hence improving vision by helping your eyes to overcome night blindness. Diets that include tomatoes have been linked with reduced risk of some neurological diseases (including Alzheimer's disease) in multiple studies. Tomato-containing diets have also been linked in a few studies with reduced risk of obesity. (whfoods.com)

Eating tomatoes has long been linked to heart health. Fresh tomatoes and tomato extracts have been shown to help lower total cholesterol, LDL cholesterol, and triglycerides. Due to potassium and vitamin B, tomatoes help to lower blood pressure and to lower high cholesterol levels. This, in turn, could help prevent strokes, heart attack and other potentially life-threatening heart problems.

So, eat 'em fresh, in season, local and unaltered. The way God intended. Not tennis balls of nothingness. And oh, yes...God helps those who help themselves.

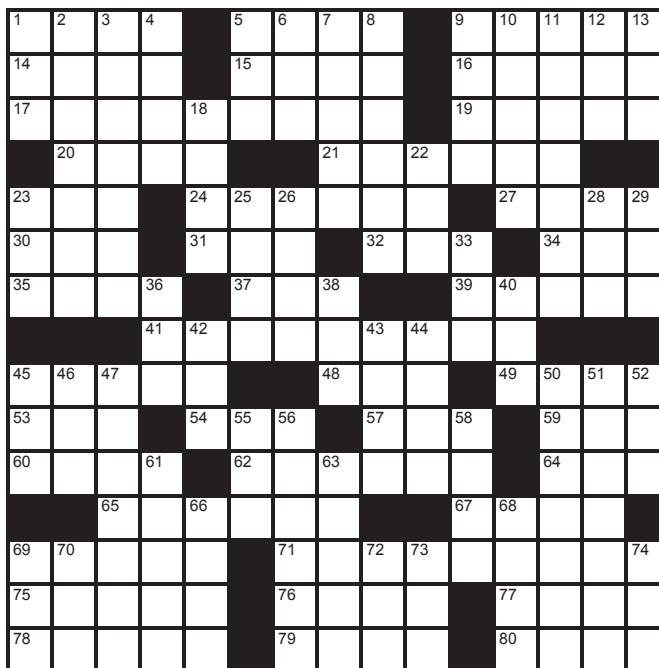

# Before you go any 'further'

## GRAMMAR GUY

**Question:** "Jordan, a few years ago Ford Motor Co. used the tagline 'Go Further.' Would you please explain the correct use of 'further' vs. 'farther'? I would prefer to rely on the Grammar Guy rather than Corporate America for grammatical guidance. After all, the business world gave us 'Lands' End,' 'Eat Fresh' and 'Rethink Possible.' Thank you for furthering the cause of good grammar."

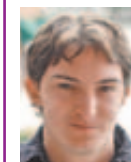
Answer: Hi Nancy ... to be fair, the business world also gave us Dodge Ram, which is a pretty fun little oxymoron to see roaming around town.

More to your point: There can be some ambiguity between whether "further" or "farther" is the correct choice, and this happens to be one of those occasions. Let's talk about why.

Both "further" and "farther" have historically been used as the comparative form of "far," meaning "at, to or by a greater distance." The Oxford Dictionaries will tell you "further" and "farther" may be used interchangeably in that meaning, as they have been for hundreds of years.

"Further" has more uses, though. Unlike "farther," which is limited to descriptions of actual distances, "further" is often used metaphorically or abstractly (ex. "to further a career").

Because of this, many grammar guides – I include myself among them – suggest simplifying the situation by using "farther" in all contexts describing actual, physical distances, and "further" only for abstract or metaphorical uses. Otherwise you could end up like Ford Motor Co., where my response to their slogan is, "Go further what?"

As summer comes to an end, there are some things that are just bound to have happened. Things that happen annually with such regularity one could almost set their clock to them. Even after repeated warnings, people still burn themselves with fireworks. Films are also predictable. Marvel will release three or four films about those characters everyone loves. Adam Sandler usually has a film hit theaters sometime between mid-July and early August. Once again, Sandler's latest film, *Pixels*, recently hit theaters.

*Pixels* focuses its attention on the original, classic arcade games. The story really is unlike anything that's been released in recent memory, that's for sure.

As fun and enjoyable as the story is due to the creative enemies and the fantastic visual effects, the acting is off. Sandler appears to be phoning this one in. He plays the same role and tells the same kind of jokes that we've heard and seen in every one of his movies for the last ten years or so. Josh Gad, a video gamer obsessed with government conspiracies, is the only one who appears to be trying.

*Pixels* is an odd film but it still manages to be moderately fun. Anyone familiar with classic video games should enjoy this one. *Pixels* is one of the best things Sandler has done in a while. 3 out of 5.

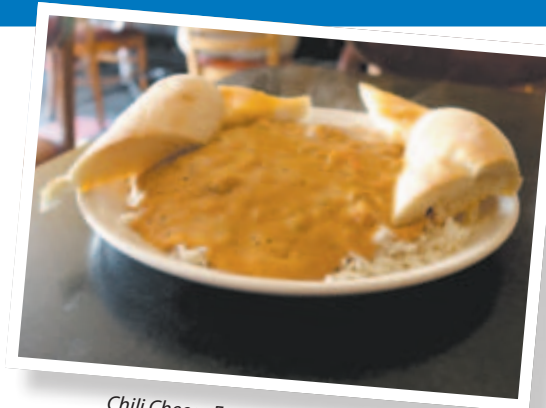

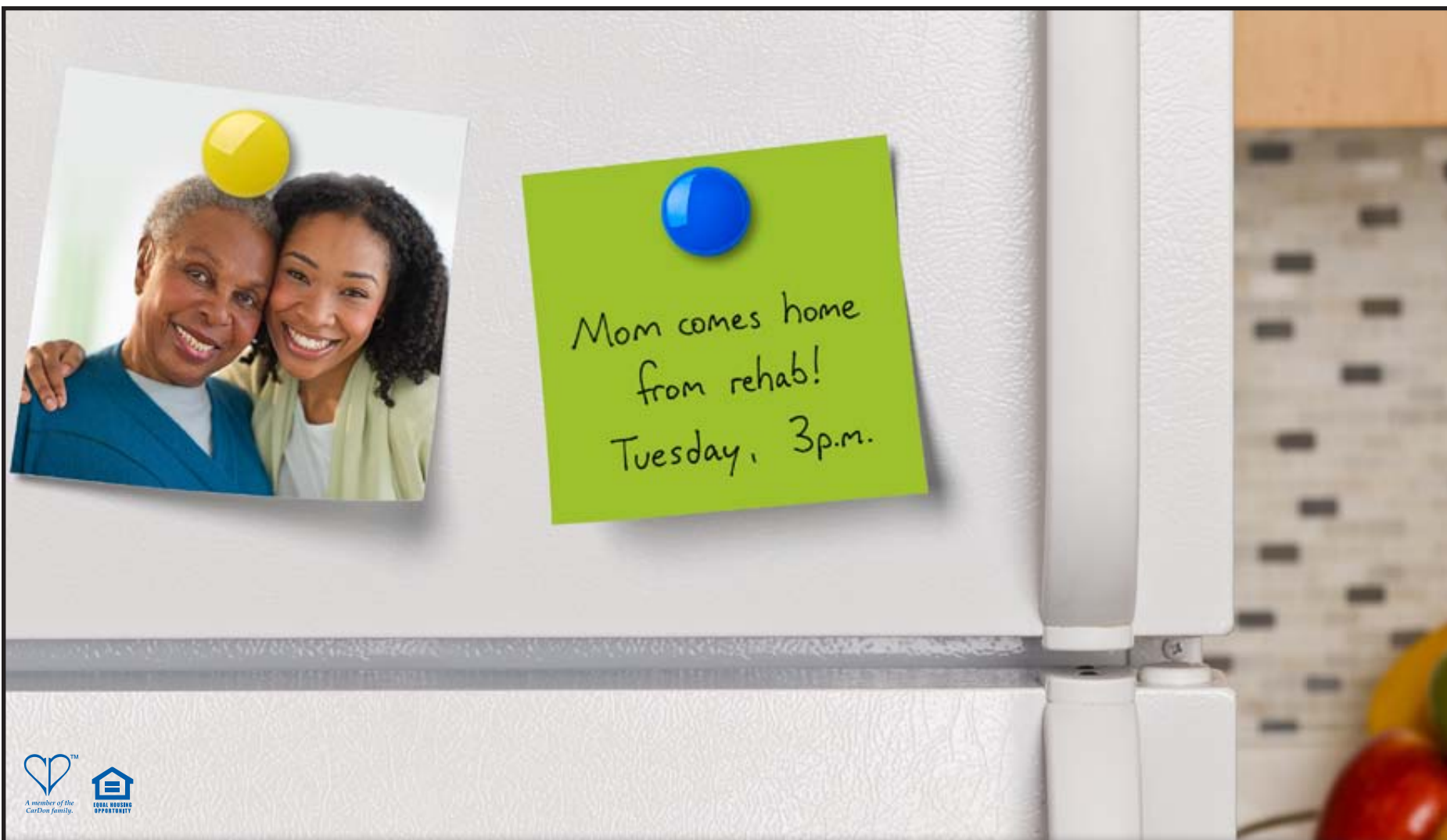
