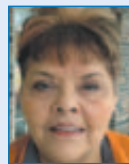

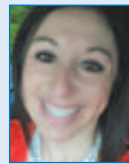
**Q: What have you been postponing that you would like to do or finish this year?**

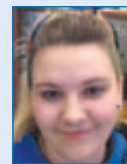
Jami Crouch, works in Franklin Township

## David Howe

### Southport police officer designs recently accredited Southport Police Academy

#### BEHIND the BADGE

Major David Howe said he believes if you want to have an impact on a community, joining a smaller police department is the way to do it. His entire career in law enforcement has been for reserve departments, volunteering his time – and a lot of it.

Howe grew up in Knightstown, Ind. and moved to Indianapolis in 1995. He began his law enforcement career in 2002 when he was hired onto the Indianapolis Park Rangers. He works full-time as a security manager, detailed to the Adidas Group. He currently resides in Wanamaker with his girlfriend, Brandi and her son. His children are Ricky, Christian, Addison and Landon.

Howe came to the Southport Police Department in 2009. In 2010 he went through officer instructor school and took over training for the department.

"The reason I do it is because I love what I do," Howe said. "To make an impact on people there and build the name of Southport up, that's really my goal."

Earlier last year Howe began putting all of his time into developing a police academy for Southport. He had more than 500 hours invested into planning the academy before it started in August. He continued to work throughout the year to get the academy certified by the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy (Tier II). The academy received that certification late December.

"What we'd love to do now, is take this reserve academy that we have now and open it up to other agencies that would like to come, to make Southport be a training hub for smaller communities," Howe said.

#### What was your inspiration to become a police officer?

Ever since I was a little kid growing up in Knightstown, Ind., I was always interested in police work. I remember walking into to police department to ask the question "If drunk

driving is illegal, why do you have a bar next door to the police department?" Obviously, it was a much different time back then.

#### What has been one of your most gratifying moments on the job?

Helping people. That's the whole reason I got into this job. Thought it sounds cliché, that's the essence and core of policing. It's not to "arrest the bad guys," but to hopefully impact someone's life in a positive way at a time when they need it the most.

#### What aspect of the job do you find most challenging?

Trying to improve our community policing to show our connection with the community so they don't just "believe what they see in the media."

#### What do you enjoy doing in your off-time?

Physical training and martial arts. These have both always been passions of mine. But I seem to have less and less time to do either of those lately.

#### What are your future goals, professionally or personally?

One of my first goals is to help bring training to the smaller agencies throughout the local area. This is being accomplished through our ILEA-certified Tier II Reserve Police Academy. I would also like to become an Assistant Chief of Police (for the Southport PD) someday.

#### What would you have done if you hadn't of become a police officer?

A local professional Martial Arts Trainer.

### Southport Police Academy receives certification from Indiana Law Enforcement Academy

With a considerable shift in today's society with unrest between the community and the police force, up-to-date training should be on the front burner of every police department.

Southport Police Department's Major David Howe said that's why Southport has spent so much time and energy in training its officers, producing the best police force it can place within its city's streets. After more than a year of research, planning and forming the Southport Police Academy, the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy (ILEA) has granted Southport a Certified Reserve Officer Academy (Tier II).

"It's a big win for the city," Howe said. "We're a small city. To get this accomplished as a team is something that should make the citizens of Southport proud. This is quite an accomplishment for a department our size."

ILEA's Tier II certification is designed for agencies such as Town Marshals, DOC Police, Gaming Commission and Hospital Police. The Southport Police Academy is one of only three training programs in the state with this certification and the only full-time reserve department.

The Southport Police Academy began in August, with classes meeting at Harrison College. The training staff includes: Chief of Police Thomas Vaughn, Major David Howe, Sgt. Aaron Allan, Instructor Lamar Jones, Instructor Richard Weinblatt and Instructor Craig Whited. In addition, several guest instructors from other local agencies volunteer their time and services to ensure the academy runs effectively.

Howe built the foundation of the curriculum around ILEA's minimum of a 332-hour academy. He increased the minimum hours required for training aspects such as vehicle stops. The academy brought in subject matter experts such as officials from the Julian Center for Domestic Violence.

Coming up this month, the 12 men who have almost completed that academy will graduate and begin their careers in law enforcement. The Southport Police Department is currently accepting applications for its ILEA Certified Reserve Officer Academy that is scheduled to begin April 2, 2016. 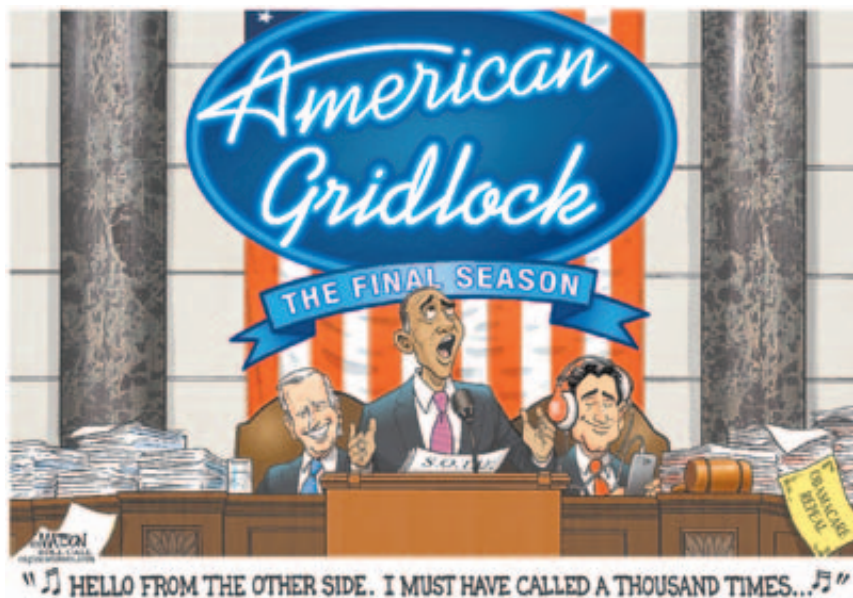

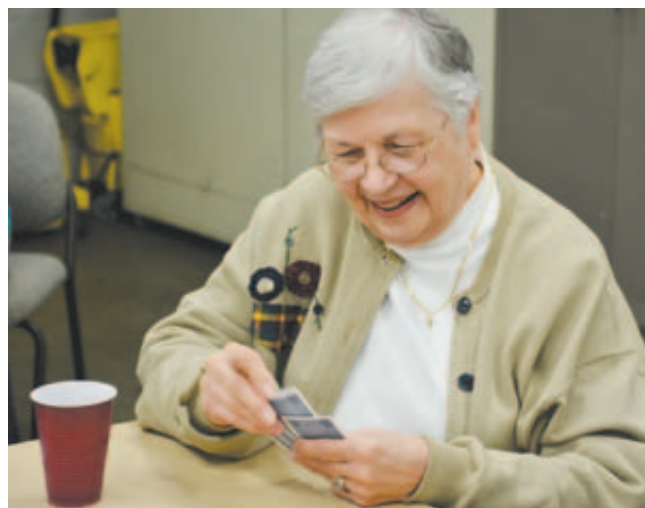

# Give me shelter

Rosie Ellis has a passion for animals. She is happiest when she can pair cats and dogs with families that love and care for them. It's how she got involved in rescuing animals and eventually started Southside Animal Shelter. To date, the shelter has rescued more than 20,000 cats and dogs.

"Everyone who works here loves animals," Ellis said. "They're not doing it for a high pay because this does not (pay a lot). They're here because they love the dogs and cats."

Ellis began rescuing animals 30 years ago. She lived near Edgewood Feed & Seed which would have a cage outside with kittens up for adoption. She noticed many of the kittens would have runny eyes, respiratory problems or fleas. She started working with South Side Animal Hospital and South 31 Veterinary Clinic to get the animals health problems fixed. She received nonprofit status to begin Southside Animal Shelter in 1994.

Ellis said she couldn't do all that she does with the shelter without the support of her husband, Tom. They have been married 54 years, have two sons and a daughter-in-law. They moved to Perry Township in 1972 and have recently purchased a new house near St. Roch Catholic Church where they plan to move this spring.

The shelter, at 1614 W. Edgewood Ave., adopted out 1,790 dogs and cats last year: 449 dogs and 1,041 cats. Most of the animals come to Southside Animal Shelter through Indianapolis Animal Care & Control, while some are animal surrenders from homes where owners can no longer care for them.

"My main love is Indianapolis Animal Care & Control," Ellis said. "I try to go to animal control as often as I can. They get some of the best animals. There is a need in Indianapolis for rescue groups like ours."

Adoption fees go back into the care of the animals

at the shelter. All animals are spayed and neutered, vaccinated and healthy when they leave. They take in animals that are sick and injured and treat them. They've seen animals that are paralyzed, heartworm positive, have been hit by cars, need to have bladder surgery or other surgeries. There

is a full-time staff, taking care of the pets seven days a week. Ellis continues to work as a volunteer.

While money is a constant challenge, Ellis said it seems like donations always comes through at the right time. The shelter will host its largest fundraiser, Pasta for Pets, on March 4, 7 – 10 p.m. at Primo Event Center, 2615 National Ave., Indianapolis. Tickets are on sale now for \$45, including an Italian dinner, entertainment, live and silent auctions.

Southside Animal Shelter sits on three acres of land, where all pets are kept indoors during high or low temperatures but have space to play outside when the weather is nice. In 2015 the shelter remodeled the cat room to have more free-range space, with boxes attached to the walls that the felines can climb up and play on. This year, Ellis said they plan to redo the dog room and make it more people-friendly. They are hoping to earn enough funds to paint the walls and rethink the cages.

Since animals need to be inside this time of year, the shelter is currently full of large dogs. Staff also fosters some animals, all having their favorites.

"I love the senior dogs, so I have a lot of seniors at my house right now that are on medication," Ellis said. "I have my favorites; I usually have small dogs. Then I have four cats."

Ellis said she looks forward to the continued improvements in the coming year, and seeing how many pets they can put in good homes.

"We stand behind our pets," she said. "We try to send them out as happy as we can. I've been doing this so long, I feel I have a good reputation in their welfare and always try to be fair."

## If you're cold, they're cold

Rosie Ellis, Southside Animal Shelter founder, said she's happy about a new ordinance that came into effect this year regulating treatment of animals in high and low temperatures.

The ordinance states that dogs must be brought inside if the temperature is above 90 or below 20 degrees, when there's a wind chill warning, tornado warning or heat advisory. If the temperature is below 40 degrees, the owner must put proper bedding in a dog house, such as straw bedding.

"Recognize, especially for short-haired dogs, if you're cold then they're cold," said Southside Animal Shelter employee Sara Breining. "They're not biologically able to handle the frigid weather just because they're dogs. Their bodies are similar to ours and they are going to get cold as well. You should pay attention to how long they're outside just like you would a child."

Help is available for those Indianapolis residents who need it. The FACE Low-Cost Spay/Neuter Clinic and IndyFeral along with FIDO (Friends of Indianapolis Dogs Outside) are offering supplies for animals who are at risk due to the forecasted dangerously low temperatures. # The Forest... a bore fest

January is an opportunity for new beginnings, a chance to start over. It's a time brimming with anticipation, simply due to the fact that another year brings with it a feeling of excitement and an overwhelming sense of eagerness for the possibilities of the upcoming year. Those recently declared New Year's resolutions are fresh in the mind. Unfortunately, with this renewed sense of optimism, January also brings with it frigid temperatures, bones-chilling bouts of wind, and usually an excessive amount of snow. Another often over-looked, but just as annual an aspect of January is the usual dreadful slate of January releases. January 2016 is kicked off with the release of *The Forest*.

*The Forest* is a supernatural thriller, horror film starring Natalie Dormer of *Games of Thrones* fame as Sarah. The film begins with our protagonist leaving a Tokyo airport, having flown several thousands of miles to search for her missing, troubled twin sister Jess. During her search for her disturbed sibling, Sarah learns that Jess visited a Japanese forest where individuals commonly go to commit suicide. Accompanying Sarah on her quest to find her sister in the creepy forest is the seemingly friendly writer Aiden. However, the expedition doesn't go as according to plan. Things go from bad to worse as the line between what's real and what isn't

becomes extremely muddled.

For a film that's technically classified as a horror film, the story does not provide many scares. Instead, the film consists of several long extended sequences of the main character looking very pensive as she wanders around searching for her sister. The film's few "scares" are comprised of predictable moments meant to get the viewer to jump from an odd, disfigured or grotesque-looking elderly person.

In addition to a horror film without many scares, the main characters are bland and boring with very little personality. Expressions and emotions exhibited by the characters are the only thing that occurs less often than anything really, truly scary. Very little back-story is also provided on anyone, leaving characters feel very flat and unreal.

While *The Forest* is a horror film, if you're looking for a scary good time, look elsewhere. The film is an hour and a half bore fest, which is neither scary nor interesting. *The Forest* also ends in an extremely incomprehensible and dumb manner. It likely won't be the worst of the film, but at this point it's in the lead.

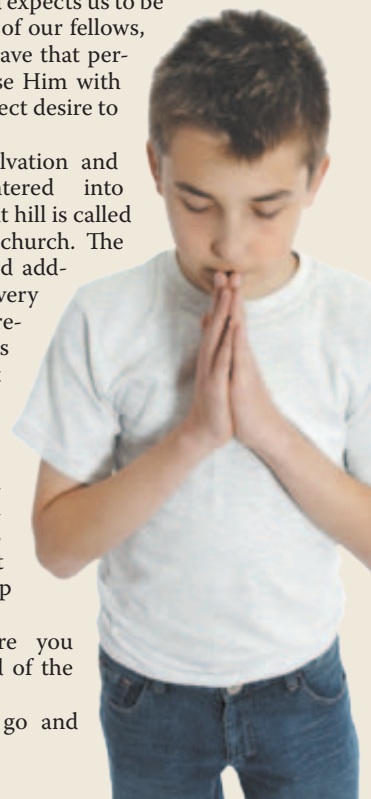
It is not that God expects us to be perfect in the eyes of our fellows, He expects us to have that perfect desire to please Him with our lives and a perfect desire to win others to Him.
