

COVID-19 creates significant complications for health care systems and patients

With COVID-19 positive tests skyrocketing and hospitals throughout the country



overflowing with inpatients, the demand for care has lately reached a level previously unseen, while providers are facing exhaustion, supply chain issues in some instances and a variety of labor force challenges.

Health care providers are busier than ever and Eskenazi Health wants you to know that due to increased patient volume and the constantly evolving situation with COVID-19, there may be a longer wait time to be scheduled for an appointment. All health systems, including Eskenazi Health, are facing similar situations with having a greater demand for care than the number of team members and appointments that are available.

It is also important not to go to an emergency room for a COVID-19 test unless you are ill. Emergency rooms across Indiana are very busy and there are many testing options that are available elsewhere. To find a testing location near you, please visit Coronavirus.IN.gov.

All of that being said, it's important to not delay seeking care when needed for conditions including but not limited to high blood pressure and diabetes, and for mental health care needs.

Options exist to connect with your provider, including using applications like Eskenazi Health MyChart, where online you can request medication refills, schedule appointments and view all other patient medical data,

medication instructions and summaries from previous appointments.

To set up an Eskenazi Health MyChart account, please visit MyChart.EskenaziHealth.edu on a computer, tablet or smartphone and click "Sign Up Now" in the "New User?" section.

For assistance with MyChart, please call (317) 880-2273.

Patients with active Eskenazi Health MyChart accounts can securely send messages with their care teams and get support for medical questions and other health care needs that do not require an appointment.

The COVID-19 vaccine (or booster when appropriate) along with practicing other safety measures, remain of utmost importance and the most effective way to combat this terrible virus mainly because people who are vaccinated have milder symptoms and do not require hospitalization or to be seen by a medical provider.

It is critically important to receive the booster vaccine for the best protection and to reduce your risk of sickness and hospitalization. The booster can be received if your last Pfizer or Modern shot was more than five months ago, or your Johnson & Johnson shot was more than two months ago. Receiving the booster shot is recommended even if you have had the COVID-19 infection.

If you are experiencing symptoms of the coronavirus, please contact your health care provider for medical advice. Hoosiers can also get tested for free. Again, to find a testing location near you, please visit Coronavirus. IN.gov.

In addition, information will soon be available about COVID-19 at-home testing kits. Please be on the lookout for that information.

Mask wearing is still required among staff, patients and visitors in Eskenazi Health facilities and is recommended for time indoors in public spaces when social distancing is difficult to maintain.

For patients with upcoming appointments, please be advised that visitation restrictions are in place and you should plan to arrive to your

appointment independently (by yourself). Please make arrangements for childcare if needed.

Pediatric patients and those requiring assistance will be permitted to have someone attend their appointment with them. This includes some vulnerable patient populations (e.g., patients with dementia, Down syndrome, autism, hearing impairment, etc.)

A Hero

No good deed goes unpunished

The Iranian writer/director Asghar Farhadi has made a career for himself exploring simple moral dilemmas and finding within them complex human truths. Originally finding international acclaim with his 2011 Academy Award-winning film, A Separation, he used the framing device of a divorce to explore themes like class, family and perspective. Farhadi has a keen eye for excavating these scenarios for each and every morsel of emotional and intellectual intrigue. In a lot of ways, his films feel like a snowball rolling down a hill; each film starts calmly, quietly and clearly linear before growing in speed, scale and intensity until it becomes like an avalanche, destroying any easy moral reading of the film's events. A Hero adds to Farhadi's lineage of moral tales, but this one explores uniquely modern ideas through his timetested narrative framework.

When the film begins, we find Rahim held in prison by his creditor. However, while on leave from prison, Rahim and his bride-to-be hatch a plan to get him released. Using a bag of gold coins found at a bus stop he and his partner attempt to negotiate with his creditor to have him released so they can get married and work off the remainder of his debt. However, due to a series of overlapping conditions surrounding his creditor, his debt and the gold itself, Rahim makes the decision to try and return the gold to its original

It goes without saying that if you are a fan of Farhadi's films this will absolutely be for you, however it is not the film to make nonbelievers into converts. A Hero sticks tried and true to Farhadi's trademark narrative style. Thankfully, the ideas being explored by Farhadi have never been more complex or modern. Most obviously, the film is an exploration of the weight and consequences of the public eye. The way Rahim is constantly assaulted from all sides with opinions and thoughts about his character, looks, or actions is a remarkably visceral recreation of life in the social media 24-hour news cycle.

I can imagine some viewers unfamiliar with Farhadi might find A Hero relatively dry. Farhadi is a cinematic formalist and favors careful blocking and shot composition over a fast pace, flashy cuts, or non-diegetic musical cues. It is certainly a challenging watch compared to modern Hollywood conventions, however great performances and narrative momentum are enough of a hook to keep new audiences entertained for the magic of the film to reveal itself.

The modernization of a tested formula means A Hero is perfectly suited for audiences familiar and new to Farhadi and allows them to immerse themselves in his steady paced drama. A Hero explores class, greed, forgiveness, social media, public discourse and so much more through a bafflingly simple seeming setup. For audiences seeking a film that challenges their thoughts just as much as their emotions, A Hero is a must see. A Hero is streaming on Amazon Prime Video.





An in-person public meeting regarding the South County Line Road Project has been scheduled by the City of Indianapolis' Department of Public Works (DPW). The meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 8, 2022, at 6 p.m. at Glenns Valley Elementary School, 8239 Morgantown Road, Indianapolis, IN 46217. Doors will open at 5 p.m. to allow time for the public to review project exhibits. Please enter at Door 11

This meeting will include appropriate social distancing measures. Hand sanitation stations and face masks will be provided. The Marion County Public Health Department encourages all residents to wear masks in indoor public spaces, regardless of vaccination status.

The purpose of this meeting is to offer area residents, stakeholders, and other interested persons an update on DPW's plans to redesign South County Line Road. The project is intended to improve safety, mobility, and operational efficiency along the County Line Road corridor from the east end of the I-69 Interchange to SR 135 in Marion and Johnson counties, Indiana.

The project will include the widening of County Line Road to two travel lanes in each direction with a center turn lane, the construction of a sidewalk and multi-use path along County Line Road, the replacement of two bridges (Structure No. 49-4503F over Pleasant Run Creek and Structure No. 49-4510F over Buffalo Creek) and the addition of an access road to the Mount Pleasant subdivision from Bluff Road.

The eastern intersection of Morris Road with County Line Road and the intersection of Mount Pleasant East Street with County Line Road will be converted to cul-de-sacs, with no access to County Line Road. These changes are necessary due to the correction of the steep incline of County Line Road near Morgantown Road. Due to the permanent closure of the County Line Road/Mount Pleasant East Street intersection, a new local road will be constructed to provide access to the Mount Pleasant community. This roadway will be approximately 400 feet in length and 20-24 feet wide and will connect the Mount Pleasant neighborhood to Bluff Road.

Based on the preliminary design, it is anticipated that approximately 20-acres of permanent rightof-way, 8-acres of temporary right-of-way, and 9 relocations will be required for this project to be completed. Total project costs are estimated to be approximately \$40 million.

Maintenance of traffic will include the closure of County Line Road from Morris Street to the Mount Pleasant Bridge, including the closure of the Morgantown Road intersection during Phase I. Phase II will be constructed under traffic with lane closures.
