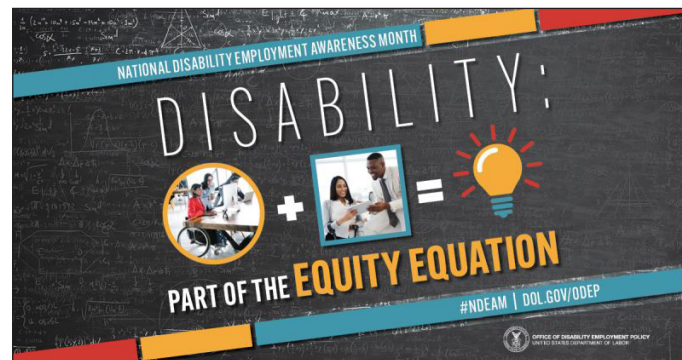

SOUTHSIDE UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Southside construction update Ramp for County Line at State Road 37 opens

• **I-69 Indianapolis:** The permanent looping ramp for northbound S.R. 37 exiting onto County Line Road is now open! It splits off from northbound S.R. 37 traffic about a half mile further south. Crews expect to shift traffic on a portion of Southport Road west of State Road 37 this week following traffic signal construction at Wellingshire Boulevard and the realigned Belmont Avenue. The new traffic signal is expected to be activated in late October or early November. Drivers are encouraged to

access Belmont Avenue where it runs along the west side of S.R. 37 from Banta Road or Southport Road to the south. Epler Avenue is closed west of Belmont Avenue with construction trucks entering and exiting the work zone.

• **I-69 Johnson County:** Lifting large beams into place for a future I-69 bridge over Bluff Creek is expected to close one southbound lane tonight near S.R. 144. Roundabout construction progress is expected to shift Waverly Park Road/Old S.R. 37 traffic this week south of S.R. 144. For more information, check i69finishline.com.

Franciscan Health hospitals close outpatient COVID testing clinics

Healthcare - Franciscan Health Indianapolis discontinued its support of outpatient COVID-19 testing for symptomatic patients Oct. 15. The hospitals report the number of symptomatic outpatients having seeking tests at both hospital locations has remained significantly low in recent months. Patients are encouraged to schedule appointments for tests with their Franciscan Physician Network doctor's offices, Franciscan Express Care urgent care clinics, or through their primary care providers. Further, patients can obtain home-based kits or seek other available testing options in the community.

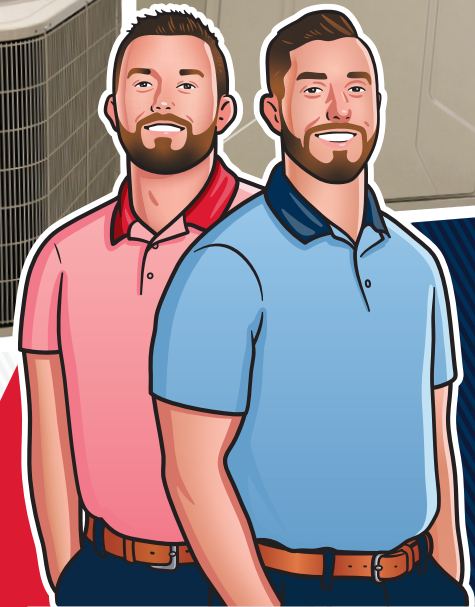
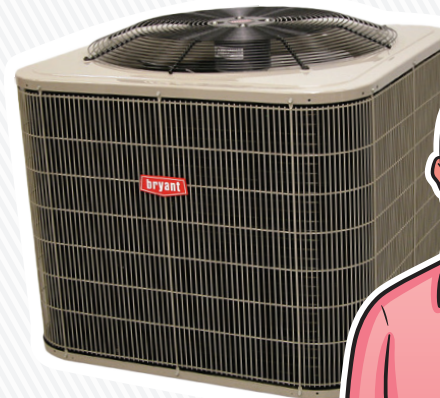

Roncalli Salutes Our Girls Soccer Sectional Champions



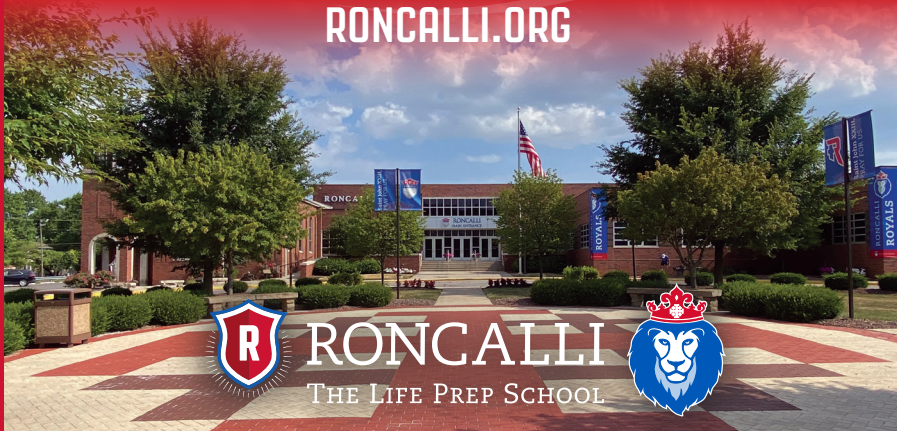

Physical therapy following total knee replacement surgery

More than 600,000 total knee replacement procedures are performed each year in the United States. As our population ages and obesity levels continue to increase, knee replacement surgeries are expected to increase.

One of the most important success factors following a total knee replacement is physical therapy and a lifelong exercise program.

Physical therapy typically begins during the hospital stay with the initial goal of getting the individual up and walking, decreasing swelling in the knee, and increasing range of motion. On the day of surgery, you likely will be using a walker and taking a few steps with the physical therapist.

In the next few weeks, you will be doing a variety of exercises with the therapist, including, but not limited to leg raises, ankle

pumps, knee straightening, and supported knee bends with a goal of reaching 90-degree flexion.

In three to six weeks, you can expect use of a cane or no device at all for walking. You will start doing normal daily tasks at home such as making your own coffee, showering, dressing, etc. You will also be working on scar mobilization and strengthening as you progress.

In seven to 12 weeks, you should have a wide range of motion and will continue with scar mobilization and strengthening as needed.

Celebrating a century in Beech Grove

Local resident rings in his 100th year with memories of serving in WW II under General Douglas MacArthur

On Oct. 16, over 100 people were gathered to celebrate the centennial birthday of Walter E. Johnes in Beech Grove. His actual birthday is Oct. 18, 1922. Since this type of celebration doesn't come around very often, Walter's daughter Mary Ann Senft pulled out all the stops to honor her accomplished father. From the dance floor to big decorations, the party was one to be remembered.

"We had door prizes at 2:30 p.m., 3:30 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. and there were a lot of them. The party was catered, and a pastry chef was brought in. We had WWII music playing featuring the music of the 'Rat Pack' and other bands from that time period. He had three cakes – one was a flag, and another was a typewriter, which symbolized his prolific writing career – he has written 24 books on top of writing editorials and newspaper articles," Senft described.

As a WWII veteran, Johnes' writing ability earned him a trip to Australia, where he served in General Douglas MacArthur's unit. Being able to type over 100 words per minute and tak-

ing shorthand allowed him this spot over 1,000 other members who had reported in his unit. He also went to Japan under that unit and did a lot of administrative work directly for MacArthur during the war.

"When he was first called into the headquarters from his unit, he thought he was in trouble," Senft laughed. "Instead they asked him to gather nine other soldiers and go to Brisbane to report under General MacArthur."

Senft and her sister Faith Johnes, among others, spoke at the celebration to honor their father. Mayor Buckley attended and also spoke at 2 p.m.

Johnes has been a lifetime resident of Beech Grove.

"He got a certificate for being a patrol officer at the school where he helped people safely cross the street. That was around 1935 so things were a little different back then," Senft said.

"He's had six kids and 14 grandchildren. He lives on his own and is very active and able to take care of himself. I'm real proud of the work he's done and the man he is," she concluded

Indiana health systems join forces to get REaL data

Campaign - Indiana University Health, Eskenazi Health and Community Health Network are launching the "We Ask Because We Care" campaign this month. The campaign highlights why it is important for healthcare organizations to gather patient information on race, ethnicity and language (often referred to as "REaL" data) and how it helps ensure that everyone receives the highest level of care. Having this information available on a broad scale will help the health systems know more about the communities they serve and the additional services they can provide to keep Indiana as healthy as it can be. 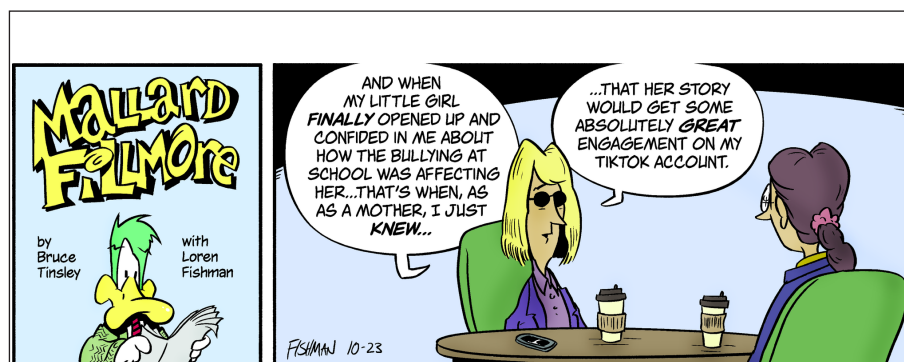

Midsommar

A beautiful day for a nightmare

Midsommar is a horror movie that shuns genre convention. Nearly all horror movies drape their scenery in darkness to hide the horrors that lurk within the blackness of night. It capitalizes on the fear of the unknown by hiding information from the audience; but what is scarier? A monster concealed by shadows, invisible to the naked eye, or the horrific knowledge of being fully aware and cognizant of the threat in front of you? If this is the question, *Midsommar* is the answer. Directed and written by up-and-coming horror superstar, Ari Aster, *Midsommar* makes it clear that Aster is here, and here to stay.

Ari Aster exploded onto the horror and art-house scene last year with his debut feature film, *Hereditary*. *Hereditary* did not just shock me, it left me utterly speechless. I had to subject myself to multiple viewings to come to grips with the film. It was overflowing with soon-to-be iconic horror imagery, immaculately detailed charac-

ter writing, and rich and impactful themes. Chief among these themes are explorations of family, sacrifice, traumatization, and ultimately, how we process grief. When all was said and done, *Hereditary* was not only one of my favorite movies of the year, but also a cornerstone in the modern horror canon.

Now, Aster's film focuses on Florence Pugh's character, Dani, suffering through an unfathomably traumatic loss. In an attempt to find closure, support, or even escapism, she embarks on a trip to rural Sweden to celebrate an annual Midsommar festival with her boyfriend and his friends from his university's anthropology department. However, soon after Pelle, played by Vilhelm Blomgren, leads the group to his small village in Sweden it becomes very apparent that they are in way over their heads.

Midsommar is a profoundly unique film, not in story or plot so much as its painstakingly detailed visuals and incomparable tone. Throughout most of the film our protagonists are on some sort of psychoactive substances that influence the look of the film by portraying the character's specific type of drug fueled subjectivity. Subtle distortion

of the colorful, brightly lit background foliage and even slight facial manipulation put the audience in an uncomfortable perspective throughout the film. It never reveals itself as scary necessarily but rather defines its horror through feelings of un-comfortability, paranoia and severe anxiety. No doubt feelings inspired by bad trips on psychedelic substances. These feelings build into a mind-bending final scene sure to stick with you for days after viewing.

Despite some wishy-washy character motivation (that actually gets fixed in the director's cut Blu-ray), *Midsommar* stands as one of the most visual striking, and emotionally resonant films of the last decade. *Midsommar* is available to stream on Showtime or entirely free with a library card on Kanopy.

In case you're wondering, you "broach" – not "breach" – the subject. This is a confusing one. Breach means "to break open," so it kind of makes sense to "break open

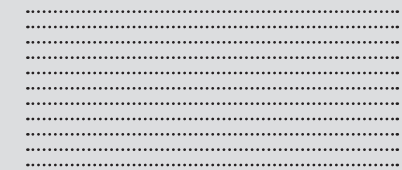
the subject." However, broach means "to bring up or suggest for the first time."

Don't let home insurance shopping scare you

Having the right insurance and enough coverage is critical in the event of an accident or damage. The key is to work with a knowledgeable, licensed insurance agent who can describe what coverage is necessary to protect against major and common accidents and weather-related events.

Why some homes have trouble with insurance coverage

Home insurance is required if the homebuyer intends to carry a mortgage. Some homebuyers may find that the home they want to buy is considered uninsurable. This generally means: One, the property is not in good enough condition to qualify for Federal Housing Administration (FHA) insurance and therefore an FHA loan. Two, the insurance company(ies) determined the house is too great of a risk to insure.

A home built in the 1920s can be difficult for a company to insure because the repairs and maintenance are more expensive. Upgrades to meet modern building codes may be necessary. Buyers interested in older homes should speak with a licensed insurance agent about what, if any changes, need to take place before it can be insured.

Another common hurdle is the property's claims history. If the home has multiple claims it can be flagged as a higher risk home. For example, if a house has a basement and the previous homeowners filed regular claims for basement flooding, then the insurance company may consider the property too high risk.

Earthquakes in Indiana

Indiana sits near two seismic zones for earthquakes: the Wabash Seismic Zone and the New Madrid Seismic Zone. Although these two zones are closer to western and southwestern Indiana, their impacts can be felt throughout central Indiana and communities north. A knowledgeable insurance agent can provide quality guidance as to whether or not a property should consider this add-on coverage.

Flood damage v. water damage

Determining where the water came from is the best way to know if damage was caused by a flood or is simply water damage. Damage caused by an overflow or rapid accumulation of outdoor water, such as rivers, ponds

and ditches may be covered under flood insurance. If it's the result of a faulty sump pump, broken dishwasher or leaky roof, then the claim would be under water damage and not a flood. An exception might be if several residents in a neighborhood are experiencing the same water issues. Insurance agents can help determine if flood insurance is a good idea.

Area floodplains can change as a result of neighborhood and commercial developments. It's important to find out if a property is near or in a designated floodplain. Homes located within a FEMA-designated flood zone may be required to purchase insurance to secure a mortgage.

How to cover rising building costs and inflation

Inflation and supply chain backups have caused building material costs to rise significantly the past few years, which is why it's important for homeowners to ensure their policy includes "inflation coverage" or "inflation protection." Regardless, the insurance company will rebuild or replace a home or belongings at current market value. According to the National Association of Home Builders, building supply costs have risen 33% since 2020.

Questions to ask an insurance agent

Ask an agent the additional following questions regarding a home insurance policy:

1. How much coverage is for personal property (the items inside the home, such as clothes, electronics, furniture, etc.)?
2. Is the home insured for replacement cost or actual cash value?
3. Does the home need sewer and water coverage?
4. Is there a separate deductible for wind or hail damage? How much is the deductible?
5. Are additional living expenses covered (living in a hotel if the home is too damaged to occupy)?

Research insurance companies and agents, and discuss home insurance options. Having sufficient home insurance can make a world of difference in the event of a catastrophic accident or storm.

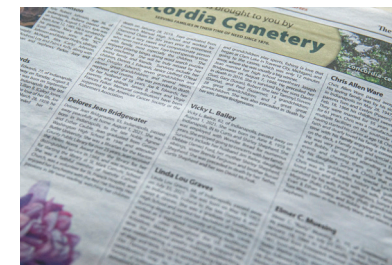
