

During an all too short social engagement with him and his lovely wife a few years back, Laura and I had the opportunity to listen to an audible hum as his brain worked. The Christmas tree, lights, presents and decorations challenge his apricot sized brain; as it should! Yet, from Dewey, he learns....

When Dewey shivers with anxiety, he likes to be covered with a comfort blanket (he has his own) as he lays twisted like a pretzel on the couch. I most often enjoy this too when I shiver with anxiety. From Jerry's close observations, he now too likes to be blanketed. However, the fat tree in the living room window confused all the kids. It became an endeavor for Dewey to get off the couch because the tree blocked his path. Jerry stared at it with remorse. Mia ignores it because she's upstairs. One evening Dewey bolted from the couch to the floor, brushing against the tree making the ornaments tinkle and the trim dance. Jerry was walking by at that exact moment. He did a broad jump to safety, looking at Laura with eyes the size of quarters. "What the hell!!" he would have said if he could speak. It's always good to keep your kids on their toes!

## **Sparking change**Franklin Central senior earns her Eagle Scout rank

Maura Sparks has been involved in scouting since she was three, long before she officially became a scout.

Growing up with a brother involved in scouting, Sparks would often attend meetings and hang around his troop. It wasn't until February of 2019 that she could official join.

"I watched my brother grow up and he had his group of friends that were really good," Sparks explained, "He had that support and I feel like I wanted to have that."

Sparks said she tried Girl Scouts but it wasn't what she was looking for. Once she joined as a scout, she said it finally gave her what she was looking for.

Sparks is a member of Troop 219, which is a reference to February 2019, when females were allowed to join scouting.

Being involved with scouting, Maura said it's shaped who she is today with more of a moral compass.

"I've known the Scout oath and law for forever," Sparks said, "I feel like that's what changed my life and how I process things and people."

One of the main activities for anyone involved with scouting is working toward merit badges. Sparks's first merit badge was crime prevention.

Every scout who wants to reach Eagle has to do some kind of project that demonstrates leadership of others while performing a project that benefits their community.

Sparks had to think of something different for her Eagle project in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic. Through four months of planning, she

came up with a live-streamed awareness campaign for community crime prevention.

She planned, found a beneficiary, worked with public officials schedules and executed a two-hour long livestream video talking about

initiatives being done to protect people in the community.

Sparks said other than changing the date, there weren't any problems she came across while working on her Eagle project.

After achieving the rank of Eagle Scout,

Sparks became one of just 20 in the state of Indiana to reach that rank. According to Scouting. org, an average of 8% of scouts ever reach Eagle, the highest rank.

Sparks said working toward her Eagle Rank taught her to be persistent, because it doesn't just come overnight. The average time it takes for a

scout to reach Eagle is around two to three years.

She said looking back on her scouting career, she will remember all of the things she was a part of. From working as a staffer at

Ransburg Scout Reservation in Bloomington, or working on staff at NYLT, the National Youth Leadership Training, she's made many memories and will take them with her throughout her life.

Her father, Erin Sparks, said he's very proud and taken aback by what she's been able to accomplish and how she's stuck with scouting even though it was stressful.

He also said her making her Eagle project relate to something she's passionate about is also important.

Maura looks to attend either Indiana State, Ball State or Vincennes University in the fall to major in criminal justice then go on to work with a police department as a detective.

She said to any other female who is interested in scouting that even though there are some controversial opinions about females joining scouts, to not make others opinions overlook you or what you want to do.

"There are going to be people who don't like change," she said, "Any they have to get used to it."



#### **Last Night in Soho** Reductive, Bland, and Unnecessary

When I first heard about Last Night in Soho, I was ridiculously excited. Edgar Wright is one of the most technically proficient directors working today and has made some of my personal favorite movies of all time. The idea he'd be tackling horror, uncharted territory for Wright, in his next film sounded almost too good to be true (and in a sense, it was). The result of this experiment is not entirely a horror film, but the true horror of Last Night in Soho is its utter failing to deliver a cohesive thematic statement about the issues it concerns itself with most.

Last Night in Soho follows Ellie, a girl from England's quiet countryside with deep reverence for 60's culture, recently thrust into the hustle and bustle of metropolitan London when she gets accepted to a prestigious fashion school. Immediately, the big-city culture of London clashes with Ellie's old soul personality and she flees student housing for an older, quieter

apartment rented out by a stern but sweet old lady. The story begins properly when Ellie first sleeps in her new place, and she begins to experience the life of an up-and-coming performer, Sandie, in the glitz and glam of 1960's London.

The performances by the main cast are all passable but uninspired. The technical aspects are again, simply unremarkable, save for one dazzling flashback sequence. So, then the film must rely on its script to pick up the

slack, but this is by far the weakest aspect of the film. It clearly wants to make a point about misogyny, but Wright's vision of feminism is archaic, reductive, and condescending.

The women of Wright and co-writer Krysty Wilson-Cairns' script are helpless. Even the seemingly self-empowered Sandie is incapable of taking control of her situation because the film is so insistent on making her suffer. The film mistakes portraying women's struggles with parodying them. It is both deeply pessimistic and gleefully unaware so eventually, it becomes impossible to take it seriously. I wouldn't be this harsh on a film's messaging had the film not insisted upon its importance so

much in the first place. Theme isn't an aspect of the film, it is the aspect of the film that speaks loudest.

It is disappointing because Wright clearly has a keen eye for identifying interesting films to pay homage to; genre films of the 60s he references include Psycho, Peeping Tom, and Blood and Black Lace. However, he falls short of those great works because unlike all those films Last Night in Soho gets bogged down in a subject matter that Wright has no personal experience with and, therefore, he lacks the necessary understanding to comment on in any meaningful manner. Last Night in Soho is currently in theaters only.
