WellSpring to organize annual Taste of the Southside in 2020

The Taste of the Southside, previously owned by The Greater Greenwood Chamber of Commerce, will be operated by WellSpring, a nonprofit organization based in Martinsville, IN that serves homeless families located in Johnson and Morgan counties. The Taste of the Southside, which celebrates its 28th year in 2020, is the longest-running food and beverage tasting event on the Southside. The American Heart Association founded the event in 1992, and the Chamber hosted from 2001 through 2018.

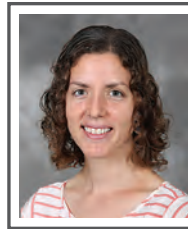

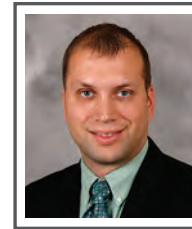

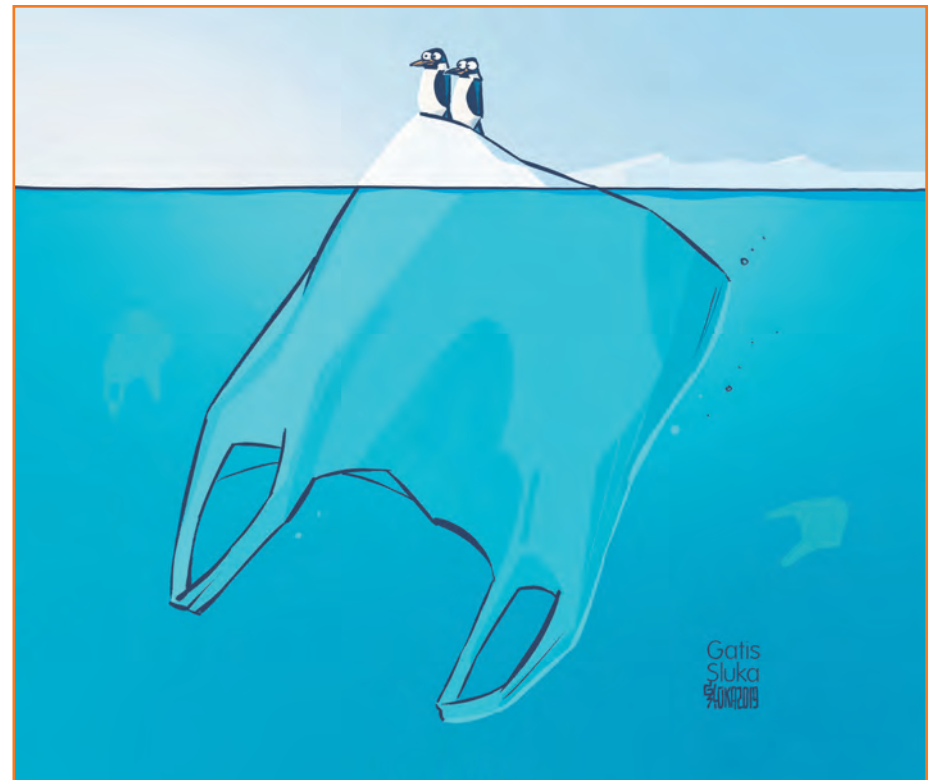

Johnson County to host events for National Suicide Prevention Week

Suicide rates have taken an alarming spike in the United States in recent years. Between 2000 and 2016, there has been a 30 percent increase in deaths by suicide, about 1 percent per year from 2000 through 2006 and about 2 percent per year from 2006 through 2016 (apa.org/monitor/2019/01/numbers). Suicide was also the 10th-leading cause of death in the U.S. in 2016 (the second-leading cause among people ages 10-34 and the fourth-leading cause among those ages 35-54).

The Suicide Prevention Coalition of Johnson County is bringing awareness and skill building events to Johnson County starting this Saturday through next Thursday:

QUESTION, PERSUADE, REFER GATEKEEPER (QPR) TRAININGS: Sept. 7-12. Each two-hour training will be held in a different time and location around the county to increase the number of citizens trained in warning signs and risk factors of suicide. People trained in QPR learn how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade and refer someone to help. To register for these free trainings, go to hope4johnsoncounty.eventbrite.com.

SUICIDE: THE RIPPLE EFFECT: Sept. 12. This film is part of a global mission to help reduce the number of suicides and suicide attempts around the world by sharing stories of survival and recovery. Dinner will be provided at 5:30 p.m. with each free ticket to the movie. The movie starts at 6:30 p.m. This movie may be triggering for many individuals as it discusses the suicide attempt made by Kevin Hines. The Suicide Prevention Coalition will have a table of resources and additional individuals available to provide support to those who need it. 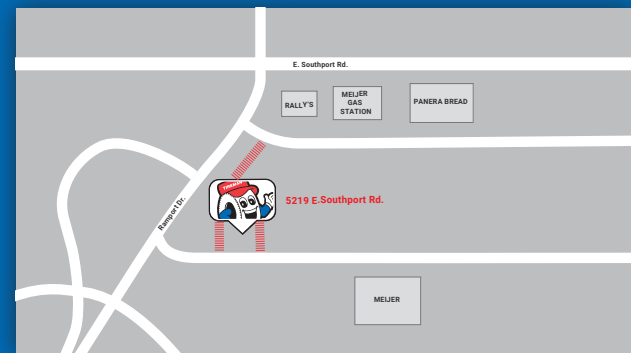

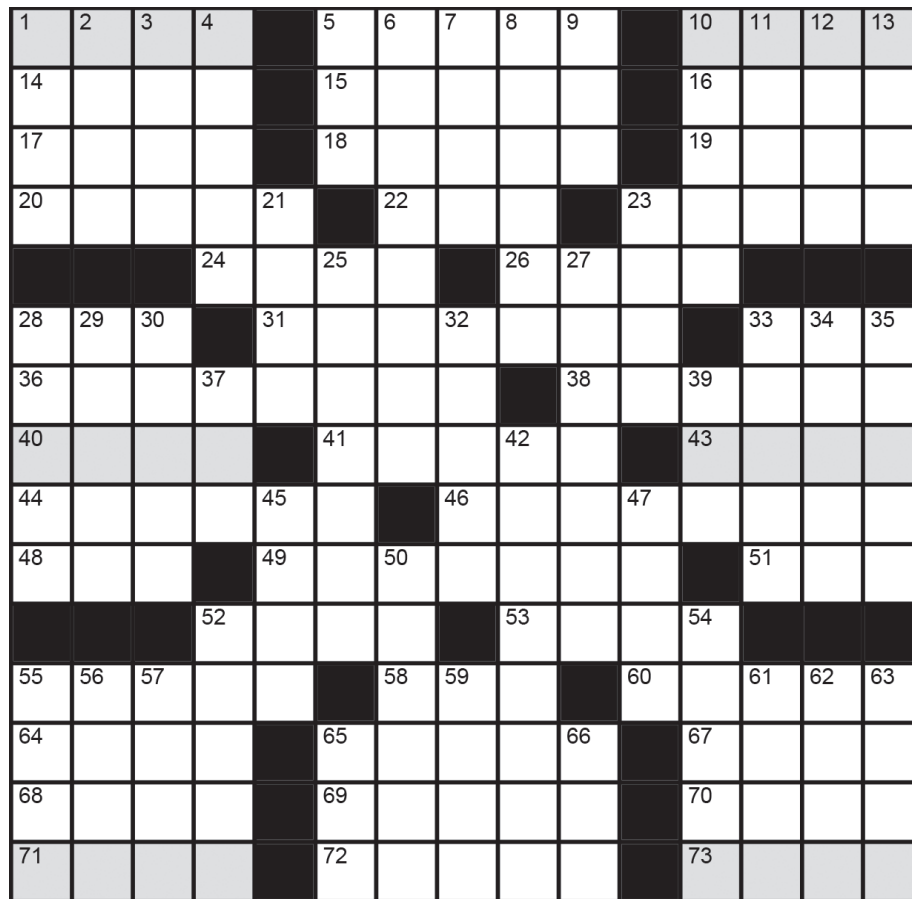

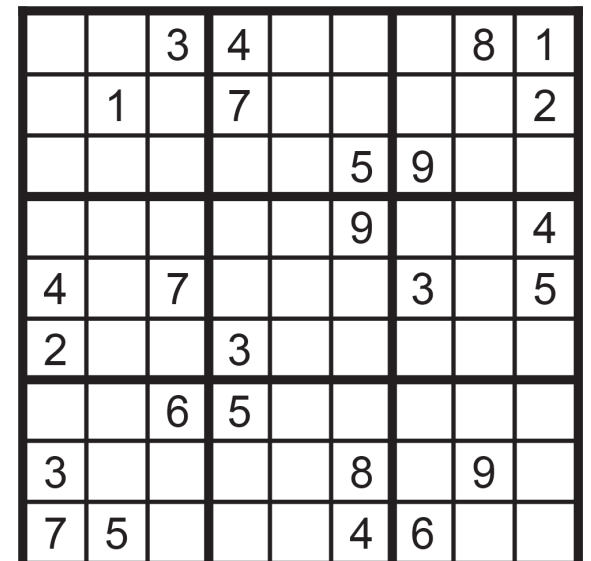

Franklin Central Marching Flashes to perform in competition this Saturday

Marching band – The Franklin Central Marching Flashes have seen tremendous growth over the past few years, increasing from 190 students in 2015 to 284 students in 2019. Highlights from this past school year include two world premieres performed by the top concert band, the indoor percussion ensemble placing 9th at WGI World Championships, the varsity guard winning their first state championship and the top three concert bands earning gold ratings at contest. They were one of the few schools in Indiana to earn the coveted Indiana State School Music Association "All-Music" award for high marks in marching band, concert band, jazz band and Solo & Ensemble contests. This year, the band will be travelling to Orlando during spring break to perform in a Disney World parade. The band directors are Evan Cooper and Derek Ellinger. Franklin Central's first marching band competition is Saturday, Sept. 7 at Decatur Central High School.

SALUTE TO OUR SOUTHSIDE HEROES

Southside fire and police departments experience growth through expansion, grants and improved training

A new digital collection of history

The Indianapolis-Marion County Public Library currently houses a digital collection of materials from the Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department and the Indianapolis Fire Department. This collection features log books, dispatch recordings, personnel records, newsletters and photos that date all the way back to the 1870s.

"This collection is the most complete and definitive collection of documents, photographs, videos and other exhibits ever compiled," stated IMPD Deputy Chief Michael Spears. "We hope citizens of Indianapolis and others throughout the world will enjoy reviewing our accomplishments and heritage."

"The Indianapolis Fire Department has a rich and proud 160-year history, and through our partnership with The Indianapolis Public Library, we are preserving that history for future generations," added Tom Hanify, president of Professional Firefighters Union of Indiana, said.

A new home to serve community needs

The White River Township Fire Department will be moving into a new fire station on Nov. 15.

"I'm really proud of and complimentary to

INDOT for our working relationship," said White River Township Fire Department Chief Jeremy Pell. "They've replaced this fire station. They're actually paying for the bulk of that fire station and making this community whole."

Along with this new fire station will come other new changes and upgrades. "We're partnering with Center Grove Schools so that they have a public safety building on their campus," Pell said. "We will obviously have space for the Johnson County Sheriff's office. The station will house a fully staffed fire engine and an ambulance. It's placed in that location for the presence it will be able to provide for the school and the access we'll have to both our interchanges, which are County Line Road and Smith Valley Road. Those are huge benefits to the community and at the help of INDOT."

The department also recently received a grant from Firehouse Subs for personal protective equipment for active shooter situations.

Growth through grants

Robert Cheshire, chief of the Beech Grove Fire Department, said that the department is proud to announce that they will be a recipient of a FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant in the amount of \$28,000. These monies will be used to purchase gear extractors for each station. Extractors are used to clean firefighting gear worn by firefighters after a

fire to help reduce the risk of exposure to cancer causing agents found in smoke. Routine cleaning also ensures that the gear remains in good working order for the next fire.

The department was also awarded two other grants earlier in the year from the Department of Homeland Security and Firestone Building Products. "These grants allowed us to purchase a closed-circuit monitoring system used for direct visualizing of the airway during intubation," Cheshire said. "This state-of-the-art equipment will be utilized on emergency medical responses. This equipment will be placed on our apparatus."

Improved training and helping future generations

The Beech Grove Police Department now has the most officers they've ever had on their roster.

"We've added three officers, and we're budgeting for more," Michael Maurice, assistant chief of the Beech Grove Police Department said. "Our equipment is state of the art. We've also implemented drug testing and mental health training for our officers."

Unfortunately, Greenwood Fire Department and Greenwood Police Department were unable to respond by our deadline, but we thank them as well for their continued service.

We are dedicated to preserving the memory of the men and women who faced the tragic events on September 11 with unparalleled bravery, ensuring that we never forget their selflessness and heroism, and that those who reside within and outside the New York/New Jersey region do not either. Thanks to your help, we have been able to accomplish just that.

On behalf of The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, I thank you for your commitment to honoring these first responders and all the other lives that were lost on September 11 by accepting an artifact from the World Trade Center and creating a public display in your community or at your organization.

While the facts of that day have been well documented, many throughout the country are unaware of the health impacts still faced by thousands of responders and survivors who live not only in the region that we serve but also around the country.

With the 18th anniversary of September 11 approaching, you or your organization may be having memorial events in the coming days. These events present an opportunity to raise awareness about the continuing health impacts to responders and survivors. The information below conveys the scale of the issue and comes from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's World Trade Center Health Program, which was established by the Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act:

- There are more than 71,000 responders and survivors receiving medical monitoring and/or medical treatment for their September 11 injuries. In the past year, more than 3,600 responders and survivors enrolled in the WTC Health Program.
- September 11 responders and survivors enrolled in the program are in every state and in 429 of 435 Congressional districts. Approximately 8,000 responders enrolled in the WTC Health Program reside outside of the NYC Metropolitan Area.
- More than 33,000 responders and survivors have at least one injury or illness related to September 11 - more than 22,000 have two or more. More than 3,700 responders and survivors have cancer related to the events of September 11.

We thought it important that you and your organization know about the scope and magnitude of the health issues faced by September 11 responders and survivors across our country.

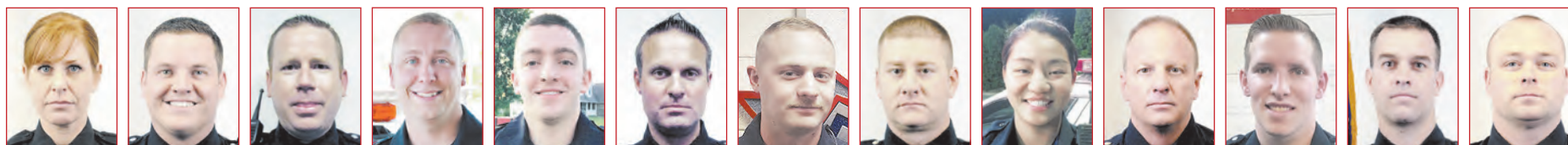

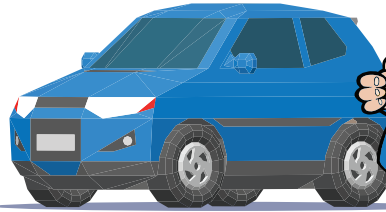

Candy corn is not a vegetable

As a Midwesterner, I have an intense fondness for corn dogs, cornucopias, popcorn, cornbread, unicorns, cornerbacks and even candy corn. And, although it pains me to say this, candy corn is not a vegetable. Don't fool yourselves, people.

What about eggcorns?

I'm not talking about some kind of newfangled, lab-based, hypoallergenic superfood; an eggcorn is an unintentional word substitution we sometimes make in a phrase because we misunderstand or mishear the original phrase. The eggcorn got its name from linguistics professor Geoffrey Pullum in 2003, when he came across an article on Mark Liberman's linguistics blog, "Language Log," that discussed a woman who substituted the phrase "egg corn" for the word "acorn." Pullum suggested that the linguistics community start referring to these phrases as "eggcorns." The moniker stuck.

The difference between an eggcorn and a pun is that a pun is intentional; to the eggcorn utterer, the phrase may be an unintentionally clever way of relaying a misunderstood phrase. Here are some examples: "pass mustard" instead of "pass muster," "escape goat" instead of "scapegoat," "bond fire" instead of "bonfire," "flush out" instead of "flesh out," and "mute point" instead of "moot point."

As you can see, these phrases actually make sense, although they're technically incorrect. I had a coworker (let's call her Nadine) who unknowingly employed eggcorns all the time. Since I didn't know what an eggcorn was, I used to refer to these phrases as "Nadinisms." She would probably accuse me of being a "rebel rouser" for putting this in print. Just know I've changed her name here because, as Nadine used to say, "it takes two to tangle." She really had a "sick sense" for eggcorns.

There certainly are a "wild variety" of them. Please note I've put all eggcorns in this article in "flotation marks" so that you know you're not seeing an "optical delusion." I just wanted to "nip that in the butt" so you didn't "take it for granite" that the Grammar Guy would ever make such an egregious error; that would certainly be "disconcerting."

And they have! “Success to us is getting to know those in the community and building relationships,” Seth stated. “The two biggest things we want to pay attention to is that we have high quality product items and putting forth the effort of being relational I think that is missing in a lot of places today.”

The atmosphere in Mocha Nut Coffee Shop is modern and fresh, conducive to meeting other people, or as Seth claims, “a chance for us to meet you.” It is a relaxing atmosphere, much like that found in college campus coffee shops. It doesn't feel rushed. The reception has been humbling, with numerous positive reviews: “The decor and atmosphere are awesome and very comfortable.” “The service was amazing!” “This was one of the most welcoming businesses I've ever experienced.”
