Global director of local ministry works to help prevent human trafficking

Seven years ago, Tom Overton began working as global director of Hope61, a human trafficking prevention ministry through One Mission Society, a Greenwood interdenominational nonprofit. Since then, more than 6,000 leaders have participated in training from the ministry's human trafficking curriculum. The ministry now includes not only traditional western missionaries, but also 16 national trainers expected to teach more than 8,000 of their own people over the next year. A speaker and trainer, Tom has ministered in more than 20 countries on six continents.

An inner city haunting to remember: Part I

A reread of a 2016 The Southside Times article which still holds relevance (at least to my wife).

In the 1960s, the house at 10th and N. Rural streets in Indianapolis was just that; a home in the inner city inhabited by Jennifer Norris, her mother, and other family members. It was a comfortable sanctuary to return to after a hard day at work. Cozy and family orientated as houses go. A Ouija board changed all that. Jennifer stated:

"It started as innocent fun ... something to do. We wanted to know who was communicating, then we all got hooked. As we became more serious 'It' got more serious. What we thought was fun turned out to be not fun at all! It started as entertainment, but we got into it deeper and deeper." She added, "Before the Ouija board everything in the house was fine, no problems. Afterwards, all hell broke loose!"

They began seances for added fun. It didn't help matters. The house changed, also changing the people inside it. The coziness disappeared.

"What we had brought in didn't hurt anybody, but they made sure you knew they were there," Jennifer said. "You learned to live with it because you had no choice." It was where they called home.

Jennifer said there was an oppressive feeling the moment you entered the house. Feelings soon turned into other things: books flying out of cabinets; beds shaking; Bibles and crosses turned upside down or even disappeared; the sound of the wadding up of newspapers; a dish cloth lifted off the kitchen floor and circulated around Jennifer's head; screams emitted out of an opened oven door. By then they had stopped the summoning and disposed of the Ouija board, but it was far too late for that. It was already there!

The house continued to be used for family gatherings on holidays and birthdays, yet it wasn't the same as in the past. The comfy family feel had been replaced by apprehension. Everyone was on edge. Jennifer lived in the house for six years and then left. She only moved back when her daughter Laura, then 17, moved in. They lived together in the upstairs apartment. Laura is my wife, and Jennifer my mother-in-law.

"When you approached the house, you felt it," Laura said. "As soon as you touched that doorknob and went inside you felt it in every room! Some areas of the house were especially dark. I always felt that way, even when I was a kid."

There was a cast iron bathtub in the upstairs apartment that gave off a particularly dark vibe. Laura refused to sleep in her bedroom, instead choosing the sofa. My wife is sensitive, proving that ability on numerous paranormal investigations in which we have participated. I would suspect that her mother is somewhat as well. Laura believes that her veil (sensitivity) could be a result of her mother's activities.

The house passed out of the family eventually, selling many times throughout the years. The upstairs apartment cycled through numerous renters. The house still stands. Jennifer has not been back, nor intends to. "When you get rid of a stalker, it's time to call it quits! I have had no interest in the paranormal since those days." They both moved past that experience, chalking it up to a bad place at a bad time of their lives. However, the memories will never fully leave them. ...

Bridges Alliance of Johnson County helps Southsiders in poverty gain self-sufficiency

Since 2016, Bridges Alliance of Johnson County has served the Southside by helping individuals in poverty gain self-sufficiency. This has been done by reducing social costs related to crime, poor health and welfare; by strengthening educational opportunities and job skills and by building sustainable communities where everyone can live safely.

“Bridges Alliance of Johnson County’s goal is to

educate about poverty and to help people move out of poverty using the model of circles, a relationship-based approach to help people get out of poverty by providing them with positive relationships with allies as they journey toward self-sufficiency,” said coordinator Marie Wiese. It’s not a mentorship as much as an intentional friendship across socio-economic and racial lines.”

Wiese works with circles organizations in both Indianapolis and in Johnson County.

Bridges Alliance of Johnson County meets every Wednesday night at Grace United Methodist Church in Franklin.

“They always start with a meal, and during the meeting there are various activities that support our circle leaders, who are surrounded by allies who lend social capital,” Wiese said. “Even in the tech age, it’s still about someone who can get you an interview or get you in to talk with somebody. Something that in the isolation of poverty you may not be able to achieve on your own. Allies provide support, encouragement, a listening ear and advice if asked. No money is exchanged. Each circle leader is surrounded by two allies, and that makes a circle. The community as a whole is working to support these circle leaders. The commitment is 18 months in that they will be in a formal relationship with their allies. That often creates relationships that lasts forever. That’s our goal: to form relationships across socioeconomic barriers.”

Where to get your caffeine fix on National Coffee Day

Sept. 29 is National Coffee Day. Did you know that coffee first became popular in the U.S. after the Boston Tea Party? The switch to coffee was seen as “patriotic,” according to pbs.org. After Starbucks debuted in 1971, the drink is accessible almost everywhere you go. A recent Reuters poll states that 63 percent of Americans age 18 and older said they drank coffee the previous day.

WalletHub compared the 100 largest U.S. cities to determine coffee friendliness, from the number of coffee shops, coffee houses and café's per capita to the average price per pack of coffee. This Sunday, show your locally-owned coffee shops some love. A few suggestions are as follows:

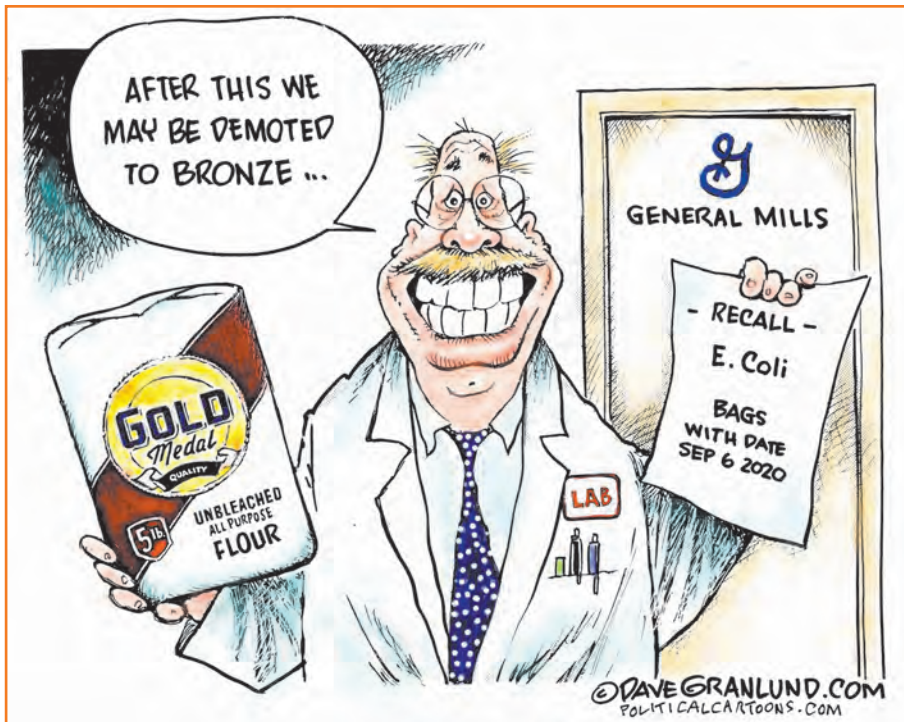

Coffeehouse Five

Like most coffee shops, Coffeehouse Five has selections on their menu you'd expect: from nitro coffee, chai lattes and caramel macchiatos to muffins, scones and breakfast biscuits. Unlike most coffee shops, all revenue, after expenses, goes to support marriage and addictions counseling services.

Brian and Michelle Peters, founders of Coffeehouse Five, started serving the community in 2010. "It was born out of a desire to create a safe and helpful place for couples struggling with their marriages and individuals struggling with addictions," Michelle said. "The idea was to create a peaceful, welcoming environment that would also generate sufficient revenue to sustain the help we wanted to provide to the community. We call ourselves a 'for-benefit' coffeehouse because we exist for the benefit of the community, not for our own benefit."

Besides typical menu items, guests can order a variety of unique food and drinks, inspired by recipes created by Brian, Michelle and their daughter Amanda, such as peanut butter mochas, java mint chip smoothies, parmesan chive biscuits, chocolate peanut putter scones

and blueberry power bars for gluten-free and vegan customers. "While we work hard to provide the highest quality products, by roasting our own beans in-house and baking all of our pastries daily, our ultimate goal is to help build a stronger community by strengthening families and marriages," Michelle said.

Coffeehouse Five is open Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. and Saturday from 7:30 a.m.-1 p.m. A worship service is held each Sunday at 11 a.m. The coffee shop is making plans to open a second location in Franklin. For more information, call (317) 300-4330 or go to coffeehousefive.com.

Ad Astra A personal journey through trauma and the infinite void of space

Ad Astra presents itself in its opening moments as a personal story that uses the backdrop of space as a storytelling device. If you were looking for another *Interstellar*, or a space traveling epic, *Ad Astra* will disappoint you. However, with the proper framing of the material, *Ad Astra* reveals itself to be one of the most introspective and thoughtful films in recent memory.

On its most base level, *Ad Astra* is about ace astronaut, Roy McBride, on a mission to find his estranged father. His father, H. Clifford McBride, is a legend in the American space program, but disappeared further into space than any manned vessel before him to find proof of intelligent life free from the magnetic constraints of the sun. Roy's journey is marked by the planets he moves to,

but the real journey is one of self-exploration, described in intimate, poetic detail by a solemn Brad Pitt voice-over narration.

This voice-over narration is simultaneously the best and worst aspect of *Ad Astra*. Without it, the film would be basically incoherent. There is very little dialogue in the film; most of the film is spent in contemplative thought. Which makes sense for the character, but more than that, it makes sense for space travel. There are no far-fetched, cryogenic sleep chambers in *Ad Astra*'s universe. Roy is awake and lonely in the outer reaches of space for most of the film. It only makes sense that the narrative would draw attention to that inner dialogue. Unfortunately, the voice-over at the very beginning and very ending undercut the themes of the film and often feel over-explanatory. Most of these instances of over-use come from the voice-over just repeating what is already observable in the scene.

The look and feel of *Ad Astra* is almost documentary. Certainly, the film is firmly with-

in the science-fiction genre, but its approach to the space travel aspect is very realistic. It feels like a very natural progression of the technology we currently use in space travel.

Ultimately, the film is at its best when it juxtaposes the vastness of space with the personal struggles within the film. Simultaneously the film makes interpersonal relationships feel insignificant and tiny within the context of space, while elevating those relationships to the highest level of priority for any and all humans. It is a beautiful contradiction that deserves to be experienced on the big screen.

Say it ain't 'so'

Is the use of a conjunction OK to begin a sentence?

When your significant other starts a conversation with, “So, we need to talk,” you know it’s over. You immediately flip through the pages of your relationship, scanning for any glaring issues or things for which you should be sorry. You’re on the defensive. You might even think about who gets to keep which friend after the impending break-up.

Some – perhaps many – people believe fervently it’s not kosher to begin a sentence with “so.” I’m here to advocate for the use of “so” as an acceptable sentence starter. If this is a dealbreaker for the relationship between you and me, then I agree that it’s time for us to start seeing other people.

“So” is a coordinating conjunction. This type of conjunction’s prime purpose is to join other sentence elements that go together. In case you’re wondering, it’s easy to remember English’s seven coordinating conjunctions – just remember “fanboys.” Fanboys stands for “for, and, nor, but, or, yet and so.” So, if this type of conjunction joins related parts of a sentence, how is it acceptable to start a sentence with one? I thought you’d never ask.

According to the Chicago Manual of Style, “There is a widespread belief – one with no historical or grammati-

cal foundation – that it is an error to begin a sentence with a conjunction such as and, but or so. In fact, a substantial percentage (often as many as 10 percent) of the sentences in first-rate writing begin with conjunctions. It has been so for centuries, and even the most conservative grammarians have followed this practice.”

If your mind isn’t blown yet, consider the famous last line of F. Scott Fitzgerald’s *The Great Gatsby*: “So we beat on, boats against the current, borne back ceaselessly into the past.” The fact is, as Chicago points out, we’ve been cool with starting sentences with prepositions for quite a long time. With “so,” we use it to mean thus, therefore, or accordingly.

While we could probably connect sentences that begin with “so” to prior sentences with semicolons to show the connection between the two thoughts, we don’t need to do this in everyday speech. If you’re addressing the U.N., maybe try to avoid starting a sentence with “so.” Otherwise, you have my permission to “so” away.

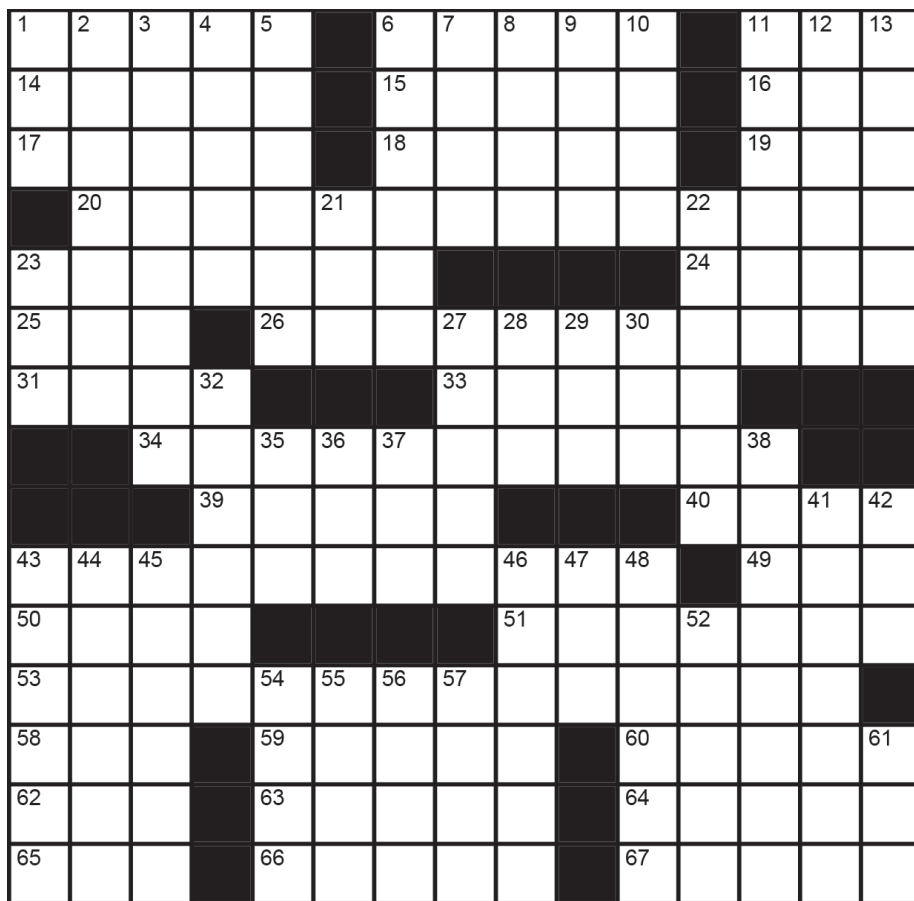

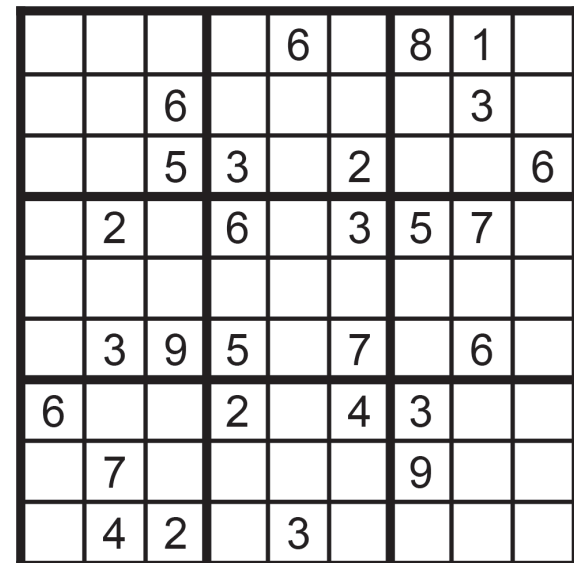
